Notes and costing assumptions:

This policy proposes to provide an additional \$50 million to the <u>Building Grants Assistance Scheme</u> (<u>BGAS</u>).

BGAS is a capital assistance grant scheme which provides funding for infrastructure for the non-government school sector.

The policy proposes that funding will be directed to infrastructure projects at non-government schools in the areas of greatest need, including areas of high student enrolment growth in line with the existing NSW BGAS Guidelines.

The grants will be administered in accordance with the BGAS Guidelines.

The policy proposes that administration of the grants will be funded from existing resources within Department of Education (DoE). Since BGAS is an ongoing scheme, the Parliamentary Budget Office considers it feasible that the DoE can administer the additional grants as part of business as usual and administration costs can be absorbed.
