In Campbelltown many of the fastest western line train services no longer stop at Westmead or Granville railway stations, and many commuters have been left frustrated by a number of NSW Liberals decision regarding train service – in particular the decision to axe direct services from Campbelltown and Parramatta. Other commuters have raised concerns about the number trains terminating at Campbelltown train station – resulting in passengers having to change services for one further stop to Macarthur train station.
