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Notes and costing assumptions:

This policy creates a Schools for the Regions Fund of \$222 million from 1 July 2023 from unallocated funds in the Snowy Hydro Fund.

The Schools for the Regions Fund will be used to:

- build a high school in Medowie to be ready for the 2027 school year;
- build a new high school in Googong to cater for 640 students;
- upgrade Jerrabomberra High School to Stage 2 for 600 students; and
- upgrade Vincentia High School by replacing 16 demountables with permanent classrooms.

Table 2 details the estimated \$222.0 million total capital spend per school of the Schools for the Regions Fund until 2027-28, which includes \$140.9 million capital over the forward estimates until 2025-26.

The policy assumes that funding for the policy will be offset with available monies from the Snowy Hydro Legacy Fund (SHLF). Based on advice from Treasury, the fund has provisioned and unallocated capital expenses that exceed \$140.9 million over the forward estimates and \$222 million overall. Accordingly, it is possible to draw on these funds for the proposed policy without affecting net lending.

Notes and costing assumptions continued:

The PBO notes that while there is nil impact on total net lending over the whole construction period, there will be a net saving of \$68 million over the forward estimates, which will be fully offset by a net cost of \$68 million beyond the forwards. This is because the provision for Snowy Hydro beyond the forward estimates is \$68 million short of the required capital funding for this policy.

Key Assumptions

This policy assumes that the purpose of the Schools for the Region Fund will be consistent with the <u>purposes of the Snowy Hydro Legacy Fund</u>, that is, to improve economic development in regional New South Wales and, for that purpose, to fund infrastructure projects that primarily benefit regional New South Wales.

The policy establishes the Schools for Region Fund based on an estimated total capital expenditure cost for four school infrastructure projects in regional NSW (refer to *Table 2*). The costing therefore excludes any ongoing operational costs such as staffing, maintenance and depreciation expenses. Further, any operational costs resulting from the projects are only expected to start after their build is completed, in the period beyond the forward estimates.

The Googong costing also includes land acquisition costs. Land for the other three sites have already been acquired. All costs exclude GST.

The PBO has consulted with the Department of Education in preparing costings for the following capital projects that will comprise the Schools for the Region Fund:

Build a high school in Medowie

Medowie is located in Port Stephens in the Hunter Region. The high school is proposed with a capacity for 640 students, with planning and construction to commence in July 2023, for completion in 2026, ready for new students in the 2027 school year.

Build a new high school in Googong

Googong is located about 10 km to the south of Queanbeyan. The new high school in Googong is proposed to cater for 640 students.

Upgrade Jerrabomberra High School to Stage 2

Jerrabomberra is a suburb of Queanbeyan. The proposal is to increase the capacity at the soon to be completed Jerrabomberra High School with a stage 2 development to commence from January 2024.

Notes and costing assumptions continued:

Upgrade Vincentia High School

Vincentia is located on the shores of Jervis Bay, 25 km south-east of Nowra. The proposal is to replace 16 demountables with permanent classrooms.
