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Notes and costing assumptions:

This policy proposes to increase funding for the NSW Council of Social Service (NCOSS) by \$2.5 million per year for the next three-year contract term. The policy specifies funding will come from Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ) and NSW Health.

In the 2022-23 NSW <u>Budget Paper 5</u> \$20.5 billion was allocated to DCJ and \$18.2 billion was allocated to NSW Health as cluster grants.

Key Assumptions:

- Assuming an even split of funding between DCJ and NSW Health, \$1.25 million of funding in each year is about 0.006 percent of the total budget for both agencies. On this basis, the PBO considers it reasonable that the agencies can absorb the cost.
- The costing assumes any agreements with the NCOSS can be modified to accommodate the additional funding.
