#### Notes and costing assumptions:

The proposal is for the responsible Minister to request the Auditor-General to review all major natural disaster relief grants programs within three months of dispersal, and to conduct performance reviews of fast-track grants programs. This policy will be on an ongoing basis. The portfolio department of the responsible Minister will refund any costs of the requested audits.

The PBO assumes that the costs of providing reimbursement for the audits can be absorbed by the portfolio department of the Minister making the request at the time; therefore, this policy will have no budget impact.

### Background

Under the *Government Sector Audit Act 1983 No 152* NSW, the Auditor-General is to provide any particular audit or audit-related service to any Minister at the Minister's request.<sup>1</sup>

#### Notes and costing assumptions continued:

There are currently five natural disaster assistance grant programs available including for natural disasters dating as far back as February and March 2021.<sup>2</sup>

The last four annual reports issued by the Audit Office show it conducts an average of 14 audits per year. Based on the current number of natural disaster assistance programs, the length of time they remain open and the number of audits conducted by the Audit Office, the PBO believes the Audit Office would have sufficient capacity to conduct these audits on request.
