Notes and costing assumptions:

The policy proposes to start a partnership, capped at \$2.4 million, with Get Skilled Access (GSA) in 2023-24 to increase participation of people with a disability in the NSW Government workforce. The following initiatives are proposed to improve inclusion of people with a disability:

- Healthcare: \$800,000 for Disability inclusive practices of health professionals in 10 hospitals through education and training.
- Employment: \$680,000 to help 8 NSW government departments to improve recruitment, inclusion, and education.
- Education: \$465,000 to provide staff and student learning about inclusivity in schools for students with disability.
- Tourism: \$450,000 to deliver a program of work to improve accessibility and disability inclusion knowledge within the tourism sector.

Given the individual proposed partnership grants represent a small portion of each relevant agency's budget, the policy assumes the funding will be absorbed using existing agency resources which the Parliamentary Budget Office deems to be feasible.

Background
