## Notes and costing assumptions:

The policy proposes to provide \$8 million over 4 years by way of annual grants to Foodbank to help schools run breakfast programs, starting from 1 July 2023.

The policy specifies the funding should come from within the existing Department of Education (DoE) grants budget. The Parliamentary Budget Office (PBO) assumes funding at \$2 million per year for this policy could be adequately covered by the DoE's cluster grants budget (for which \$128 million, for example, was allocated in the 2022 Budget for FY 2022-23). However, the PBO notes that that DoE may have to re-prioritise grant funding to do so.

On the above assumptions there is nil impact on the state budget from this policy.
