ICONIC CENTRAL COAST WALKING TRACK – STATE GOVERNMENT \$1 MILLION INVESTMENT

Friday 11 March 2011

A re-elected Labor Government will invest \$1 million to create an iconic cross-country, multiday walking track on the Central Coast – extending from Bouddi National Park on Broken Bay to the southern end of Newcastle.

The new funding will upgrade and extend some of the State's most famous walks – including the Bouddi Coastal Walk and Great North Walk.

It will link previously unconnected tracks to create a single coastal track for Central Coast residents.

It will take in some of the State's best national parks and reserves, including:

- Bouddi National Park;
- Wamberal Lagoon Nature Reserve;
- Munmorah State Conservation Area; and
- Glenrock State Conservation Area.

In addition, the \$1 million investment will fund new infrastructure such as visitor information and signage.

The walking track will benefit locals and lure tourists to the Central Coast.

Premier Kristina Keneally announced the new walking track today at Toukley, joined by Parliamentary Secretary for the Central Coast and Member for Wyong David Harris, Member for Swansea Robert Coombs, Gosford candidate Katie Smith, The Entrance candidate David Mehan and Terrigal candidate Trevor Drake.

"Walking is one the most popular physical activities in NSW – and this new track will enhance the experience for Central Coast locals and visitors," Ms Keneally said.

"The Central Coast is one of the most attractive parts of NSW, and we are creating this new multi-day track to give walkers a great perspective of the abundant natural beauty this region has to offer.

"David Harris has advocated strongly for this walking track and deserves to be congratulated for the work he has done to bring this project to this stage."

Mr Harris said: "This investment is great news – it will create a walking track that is iconic not just for the Central Coast, but for the whole State.

"Local families will be able to enjoy our region's many lookouts, beaches and nature reserves from a well-linked track that offers easy access to public transport.

"This picturesque path will also be a drawcard for visitors who want to explore the region, delivering benefits to local businesses, restaurants and hotels.

"This investment in the walking track will ensure generations of local families can enjoy the spectacular beauty of the State for years to come."

The Department of Environment, Climate Change and Water (DECCW) has advised that these works require additional funding. It is assumed the works will commence on 1 July 2011 and will be completed within the 2011-12 financial year. Depreciation is 5% per annum.

Caveats or qualifications
As DECCW receives revenue from the waste and environment levy for environmental programs and commitments, Treasury would expect these costs to be met from within the resources already allocated. DECCW should be able to reprioritise its approved capital program to accomodate this proposal, or offset its recurrent expenses with this capital cost to ensure no impact to the State's Net Lending position. In the time available however, it has not been possible to identify specific programs for reprioritisation.
Implementation issues (including how Treasury can assist in speedy implementation and any potential difficulties and how these might be overcome)
These lands are managed by the Department of Environment, Climate Change and Water. Capital works spending to upgrade, link and extend existing tracks, as well as construct visitor facilities, can be undertaken at any time.
