LABOR'S PROPOSAL TO FORM MINORITY GOVERNMENT IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE NATIONALS

Congratulations on running a brilliant election campaign. You have achieved your stated objective of winning the balance of power in order to secure better outcomes for regional communities. I acknowledge that you have a mandate to deliver this. Well done.

I also acknowledge, following my discussions with you this week, that you are committed to responsible financial management and stable government.

It is my strong belief that these objectives can best be achieved by the formation of a minority Labor Government in partnership with the Nationals WA.

Such a partnership would be enhanced by Labor's relationship with the Federal Government. We will be strong advocates for Commonwealth investment in regional Western Australia.

Labor's established machinery of government and experience will also allow early implementation of our agreed priorities.

Please find attached two documents which detail how such a Government could be structured and operate.

- A Royalties to the Regions package which details Labor's proposed \$1
 billion legislated investment fund along with suggestions for portfolio
 allocations that would provide Nationals ministers with responsibility for
 delivering projects and services to the regions worth more than \$2.8 billion;
 and
- A draft partnership agreement between Labor and the Nationals based on the governance model developed by the Rann Government and co-signed by National Party Minister Karlene Maywald.

I would be happy to discuss these proposals further with yourself or any of your colleagues.

Finally, I wish to thank you for the mature and constructive way you entered into negotiations with me this week. I believe it augurs well for any future Government you may be a part of.

Whichever decision you make, I trust it will be in the best interests of our State.

BETWEEN the Hon Alan Carpenter MP as Premier of Western Australia and for and on behalf of the Labor Party ("Premier")

And Brendan Grylls MP (Nationals Leader)

- (A) The Premier leads a minority Labor Government, which came into office on (insert date).
- (B) The Premier and the Nationals Leader agree that it is in the best interests of the people of Western Australia that three National Party members be appointed as a ministers within the Carpenter Government. In particular they agree that such an appointments will:
 - (a) Secure the position of the Government on the floor of the Legislative Assembly; and
 - (b) Make available to the Government the ministers' skills and advice.
- (C) The minority government shall operate as a partnership between Labor and the National Party and shall not be a Coalition.
- (D) The purpose of this Agreement is to record the political understandings reached between the Premier and the Nationals Leader as to how the partnership agreement should operate.
- (E) The Premier and the Nationals Leader agree that Nationals ministers will have a special position in Cabinet in that, by reason of their non-affiliation with the Labor Party, there is a class of issues in respect of which it will not always be possible for the Nationals ministers to be bound by a Cabinet decision (the class is defined in clause 3 and are referred to in this Agreement as "Issues"). The agreement reached between the Premier and the Nationals Leader is intended to reduce to a minimum any matters where the Nationals ministers will not be able to agree to a decision of Cabinet, but acknowledges that when such a circumstance arises, the parties will seek to identify it as early as possible and the Nationals ministers will absent themselves from the Cabinet discussion at the earliest time.
- 1. This Agreement is conditional upon the approval of this Agreement by the Cabinet, the Labor Parliamentary caucus and the Western Australian Branch of the Australian Labor Party (in accordance with its rules and procedures).

The parties agree that they will each use their best endeavours to obtain the relevant approvals and that, in the event that such approvals are not obtained, they will enter into discussions to ascertain if any other like Agreement can be made.

2. APPOINTMENT AS PORTFOLIO MINISTER

The Premier will advise His Excellency the Governor to appoint the Nationals ministers to ministerial portfolios to be determined by the Premier.

- 2.1 The Nationals ministers will have authority to enter into contracts on behalf of the State for the purposes of their portfolios.
- 2.2 In each of their Ministerial capacities, the Nationals ministers will be serviced by and may give directions to the Departments to which their ministerial capacities relate.
- 2.3 The Premier will, at the request of the Nationals ministers, engage personal staff selected by the Nationals ministers, in consultation with the Premier, to assist the Nationals ministers.
- 2.4 In performing their portfolio responsibilities the Nationals ministers must give effect to (in order of priority):
 - 2.4.1 Any applicable laws or directions, instructions or orders having legal effect;
 - 2.4.2 Any decisions of the Executive Council;
 - 2.4.3 Any decisions of the Cabinet;
 - 2.4.4 Any policies agreed between the Nationals ministers and the Premier;
 - 2.4.5 Save as specified in para 2.7 of this Agreement, any relevant policies announced by the Labor Party in the 2008 Western Australian election ("Labor policies"), or subsequently.
- 2.5 Where the Nationals ministers are unable or unwilling to perform their Ministerial responsibilities in accordance with 2.4, the Nationals ministers must immediately inform the Premier of that fact, together with their reasons, and will meet with the Premier as soon as may be convenient in order to seek some accommodation between them.
- 2.6 The Nationals ministers must make every effort to provide the Premier with as much notice as possible when they are unwilling or unable to perform their Ministerial responsibilities in accordance with 2.4.
- 2.7 It is understood that the Nationals ministers may not have to comply with Labor policies in relation to:
 - 2.7.1 Issues relating to the mining of uranium; and
 - 2.7.2 Issues relating to the growing of genetically modified crops;
 - 2.7.3 Issues believed to be matters of conscience.

2.8 The Nationals ministers will be bound by the Ministerial Code of Conduct except as provided for in this agreement.

3. ATTENDANCE AT CABINET

- 3.1 The Nationals ministers will be provided the same Cabinet papers as every other Minister.
- 3.2 The Nationals ministers will peruse those Cabinet documents at their earliest opportunity.
- 3.3 If, after reading a Cabinet document, in the opinion of the Nationals ministers, it would be inconsistent with the Nationals ministers' non-affiliation with the Labor Party for the Nationals minister to be bound by a Cabinet decision in relation to an issue, the Nationals ministers must immediately upon reaching that opinion, inform the Premier of that fact, together with their reasons, and will meet with the Premier as soon as may be convenient in order to seek some accommodation between them in relation to the policy and/or procedure to be followed.
- 3.4 The Nationals ministers must make every effort to provide the Premier with as much notice as possible when the Nationals ministers believe a matter for decision in Cabinet will be inconsistent with the Nationals ministers' non-affiliation with the Labor Party.
- 3.5 The Nationals ministers agree that in this Agreement, the Issues will be limited to:
 - 3.5.1 issues with direct and immediate effect upon the Nationals ministers' electorates;
 - 3.5.2 such other matters as the Nationals ministers have advised the Premier from time to time in writing.
- 3.6 If, after the meeting referred to in clause 3.3 of this Agreement, no other accommodation can be reached then the Nationals ministers will:
 - 3.6.1 immediately return to the Cabinet office all copies of the Cabinet documents and all notes or other records relating to the Cabinet documents or copies; and
 - 3.6.2 absent themselves from that part of the Cabinet discussion where the relevant matter will be or is being discussed.
- 3.7 Even where the Nationals ministers have absented themselves from Cabinet in accordance with this clause, the Nationals ministers agree that they will not criticise, comment on or disclose the relevant policy until the policy has been publicly announced by the Government.

- 3.8 The Premier agrees that the Nationals ministers, having complied with the arrangements in this Agreement, are not subject to the usual rules of Cabinet solidarity in respect of that particular matter. In particular, the Nationals ministers, whilst remaining members of the Cabinet, may criticise the particular Government policy in relation to which the Nationals ministers absented themselves from Cabinet after the policy has been publicly announced.
- 3.9 The Nationals ministers may not divulge any of the material in any Cabinet documents and are bound by Cabinet secrecy in the same way as any Minister, notwithstanding anything in this Agreement.
- 3.10 Except as provided in this Agreement:
 - (a) The Nationals ministers will be full members of Cabinet with the same entitlements to take matters to Cabinet, to discuss matters within Cabinet and to vote on matters in Cabinet as any other Minister.
 - (b) The Nationals ministers will be subject to the usual rules of Cabinet solidarity.

4. EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

- 4.1 The Nationals ministers agree that they will not provide advice directly to the Governor except with the prior approval of the Premier.
- 4.2 The Nationals Ministers agree that they will not attend an Executive Council meeting where there is on the agenda a matter upon which they absented themselves from Cabinet in accordance with clause 3 of this Agreement.

5. VOTING IN PARLIAMENT

- 5.1 Save for a matter on which the Nationals ministers have absented themselves from Cabinet in accordance with clause 3 of this Agreement, the Nationals ministers agree to support the Government in the Parliament and to vote with the Government on any matter raised in the Parliament which has received the prior approval of Cabinet.
- 5.2 The Nationals ministers are not obliged to support the Government in the Parliament nor to vote with the Government in relation to:
 - 5.2.1 Matters about which they have absented themselves from Cabinet; or
 - 5.2.2 Votes concerning Issues about which they have given notice to the Premier (unless they have voted in Cabinet in relation to that Issue).

- 5.3 Notwithstanding clauses 3 and 5 of this Agreement, the Nationals ministers agree that for so long as they shall remain ministers in the Carpenter Government, the Nationals ministers will support the Government in relation to any "confidence" motion in the Western Australian House of Assembly.
- 5.4 Nationals ministers will use their best endeavours to secure the support of other Nationals members of parliament to support the government on parliamentary votes on all matters the Nationals ministers are supporting.

EFFECT OF AGREEMENT

The parties acknowledge that this Agreement represents their understandings and intentions, but that neither party is thereby constrained from acting in what they perceive at the time to be the best interest of the State of Western Australia. However, both parties undertake, so far as is consistent with their duty, that before taking any action to bring this Agreement to an end that party will communicate with the other with a view to reaching some accommodation consistent with the intent and purpose of this Agreement.

7. FURTHER MATTERS

7.1 Uranium mining.

It is agreed that National Party ministers will not vote in a way which would compel the Government to allow the mining of uranium in Western Australia. Further, Nationals ministers will use their best endeavours to secure the support of Nationals MP's for this position in any vote on the floor of Parliament.

7.2 GM crops

It is agreed that Labor's moratorium on the growing of commercial GM food crops, including canola, will continue. However, the Government will consider allowing the growing of other GM crops for fibre and bio-fuel purposes on the recommendation of a risk assessment to be initiated by the Minister for Agriculture.

"ROYALTIES TO THE REGIONS" PACKAGE

SUMMARY

- 1. The new Government will establish a new \$1 billion Royalties to the Region Fund (see attachment A);
 - Attachment B provides information on the proposed financial aggregates.
- 2. Under a new Government, the National Party Ministers will have control over the following six portfolios:
 - Agriculture
 - Regional Development (including Royalties for the Regions Fund)
 - Regional Transport (incl Roads)
 - · Regional Housing
 - Regional Power (Horizon Power)
 - · Regional Education; and
 - Regional Health

The value of all of these portfolios would be significantly more than \$2.7 billion over the forward estimates. Attachment B presents some of the value of these portfolios, but this list is by no means complete.

In respect to these portfolios, departmental structures are to be reviewed to provide direct day to day responsibility to the regional minister, with issues of major or state-wide significance, or programs with significant whole of government implications, to be the joint responsibility of both the regional and state-wide Minister.

Details of these relationships are to be resolved between the Premier and Leader of the National Party with each committing to use their best endeavours to achieve amicable resolution.

A Cabinet regional services committee will be established to co-ordinate government regional services.

- 3. In Government the Labor and the National Party Ministers will work in partnership to implement the Labor Party's regional election commitments (these are listed in Attachment C).
 - In Government the Labor and the National Party Ministers will work in partnership to implement new projects in regional Western Australia, currently earmarked in the forward estimates (a number of projects that have either recently commenced or are due to commence are listed in Attachment D).
- 4. The new Government will provide extra funding for the RFDS and increase the boarding allowance.

PARAMETERS

- Labor's election commitments, together with its existing program will see a net debt to revenue of 42.6 per cent by 2011-12.
- The Government understands that there has been significant revenue gain due to the depreciation of the Australian Dollar. However the Government has not included this additional revenue in preparing the financial impact of the offer below as the full revenue update has not been concluded.
- The offer attached will add another \$1 billion to the forward estimates, bringing the net debt to revenue to 46.2 per cent, this is below the Government's self imposed limit of 47 per cent.
- It is not the intention of the Government to defer or cancel projects already committed to, in order to fund this package.

A New "Royalties to the Regions" Fund

- 1. The Government will introduce a new "Royalties to the Regions" Fund.
- 2. The Government will introduce legislation to create this Fund, within the first three months of the new Government. Immediately after the Government is formed, the Fund will be established administratively.
- 3. The "Royalties to the Regions" Fund will be set at a value of \$1 billion, indexed annually by CPI.
- 4. The legislation will require that at the first day of each financial year the fund hold \$1 billion.
- 5. Each year funds will be drawn from the RTR fund, and the RTR Fund will be replenished by the amount drawn.
- 6. The draw down amount will be assessed each year during the Budget process.
- 7. The Minister for Regional Development will have ministerial responsibility for the RTR Fund.
- 8. A Royalties for the Regions Commission/Council will be created. It will be a statutory body that would comprise Commissioners with expertise and knowledge of regional development and community capacity building.
- 9. The RTR Fund will be in two parts, with one part administered by the Commission and another directly by the Minister. The funding available under each part will be determined by the ERC.
- 10. In respect to the first part administered by the Commission. The Minister for Regional Development will determine the range of programs to be funded. The Commission will advise the Minister of the specific projects to be funded under the recommended programs. The Minister will provide regular reports to Cabinet of the list of projects recommended for funding.
- 11. In respect to the second part of the Fund, the Minister can make recommendations to the Cabinet for expenditure for services and infrastructure across regional Western Australia. These will ordinarily be major projects.
- 12. Over the forward estimates 2008-09 to 2011-12 a total drawdown of \$1 billion is agreed. This is a minimum figure that can be revised upwards subject to agreement of the Cabinet, informed by the Budgetary situation.
