## Recommendations of the Heritage Council of NSW to the Minister for Planning

### Recommendations from Heritage Council meetings 2001-2002

#### AUGUST 2001

##### *Heritage Incentives Program 2001-2002*

That the Heritage Council, pursuant to Section 106 of the Heritage Act:

- recommend to the Minister that he approve a continuation of the interim heritage funding arrangements adopted last year to provide continuing support for local government heritage management projects, major heritage partners and for conservation management plans on items of State heritage significance;
- recommends to the Minister that this infrastructure support will not exceed commitments of \$1.4M until 30 June 2002;
- recommends to the Minister that he delegates to the Director the approval of the specific details of the support program within the specified categories and the total amount of \$1.4M referred to above;
- recommends to the Minister that he approve the commitment of a \$100,000 to Aboriginal heritage projects approved by the Aboriginal Heritage Committee for the year ending 30 June 2002 within the 2001/2002 Heritage Incentives Program;

##### *Funding for Aboriginal Project*

That the Heritage Council, pursuant to Section 106 of the Heritage Act, 1977:

- recommend to the Minister that he approve \$15,000 towards the funding of interpretive walking trails in Northern Sydney suburbs.

##### *Adelong Gold Mine*

- The Heritage Council recommends to the Minister that an amount of up to \$30,000 be contributed from the Heritage Grants Program for the facilitation of a community based Conservation Management Plan in relation to the Adelong Goldmine as a basis for determining the future management of the place;

#### OCTOBER 2001

##### *National Parks and Wildlife*

That the Heritage Council:

- endorses the delegation of functions, as outlined in the report, to the National Parks and Wildlife Service; and
- seeks the consent of the Minister to these delegations in accordance with s.169(3) of the NSW Heritage Act, 1977.

#### DECEMBER 2001

##### *Hargraves Courthouse Site near Mudgee*

- That the Heritage Council, pursuant to Section 106 of the Heritage Act, recommends to the Minister that he approve of a \$12,500 grant to the Hargraves and District Historical Society as part of the funding arrangements for this project, the total being \$32,846.

##### *General Business*

- The Heritage Council continues to warmly support the NSW Government's heritage policy introduced in 1996 including making explicit the broad definition of heritage to encompass Aboriginal, multicultural, natural and movable heritage, and the division of State and local responsibility for heritage management.
- The Council now has the benefit of 5 years experience in implementing the policy and almost 3 years in seeking to complete the State Heritage Register, so critical to it.
- The Heritage Council advises the Minister that this experience clearly indicates the need for additional resources to extend the protection of the Heritage Act to the full range of items of State significance, through the creation of a truly representative, balanced and comprehensive Register.
- The Heritage Council recognises that the management and conservation of the bulk of the environmental heritage of NSW will rely on the capacity of local government to effectively take on this role across the state. The Heritage Council seeks the support of the Minister to provide additional resources to allow this objective to be seriously addressed over the next three years.

**JUNE 2002****Heritage Incentive Panel Recommendations**

That the Heritage Council:

- note the matters in this report and the Panel's recommended approval to the Minister on 125 projects contained in Annexure A;
- recommend to the Minister approval of delegation to the Director to approve of details of recipients and funding in the following matters:
  - a) further grants for CMPs; total quantum not to exceed the balance of \$50,000 remaining in Program 4 (CMPs); general maximum grant to be \$2,500 per project.
  - b) grants for local government heritage projects up to a total limit of \$1.2 million in Program 6 (local government heritage management) – maximum grant amount on any project not to exceed \$20,000.
  - c) grants for community based heritage agencies up to a total limit of \$400,000 in Program 7.

**Amusu Theatre and Service Station, Manildra**

- in accordance with section 57(2) of the Heritage Act recommend the Minister grant the following exemptions from section 57(1):
  - a) Maintenance, where maintenance means the continuous protective care of existing material and includes painting, provided that the final colours are those used by Sydney Harbour Ferries Pty Ltd on the vessel during the period 1951 to 1974 and do not obscure original detailing.
  - b) The minor repair of the vessel in accordance with the principles of the Burra Charter of Australia ICOMOS, where minor repair means the restoration or minor reconstruction of materials by patching, piecing-in, splicing and consolidating existing material and including replacement of components where these have been damaged beyond reasonable repair or are missing.
  - c) Conservation works in accordance with a Conservation Management Plan endorsed by the Heritage Council.

- a) The IHO be revoked following the satisfactory determination of an application under S.60 of the NSW Heritage Act (and compliance with) to move recording equipment (known as the Festival Collection at Annexure A) and as many elements of the recording studio as is practicable to another location which results in its ongoing use for recording purposes;

## Freedom of Information

### Freedom of Information 2001-2002

Seven requests were received under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act. These were:

**27 February 2002:** The applicant requested documents pertaining to archaeological reviews conducted by the Heritage Office. Due to the high volume of files and documents, a processing fee of \$1470.00 was charged.

**25 March 2002:** The applicant requested copies of all documents relating to 5 Raglan Street, Mosman. The documents, excepting seven documents refused under exemptions, were made available on 15 April 2002.

**April 2002:** The applicant requested access to all documents relating to the consideration of the development application for Tempe House. The information was provided on 10th May 2002. Fees were waived in this instance.

## Disability Action Plan

The Heritage Office is a tenant of an office tower in Parramatta which is fully accessible to disabled people and has disabled parking.

The office coordinates the meetings of the Heritage Council's Fire Access and Services Advisory panel, which has incorporated disabled access to heritage buildings as part of its brief.

The Heritage Office has prepared a Disability Action Plan in accordance with NSW Government Guidelines.

The Plan will be reviewed in 2002 in line with the move of the office to the former King's School.

## Privacy Management Plan

### Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998

The Heritage Office is currently developing its Privacy Management Plan which is expected to be finalised by August 2002. Once finalised a copy will be provided to the Privacy Commissioner, placed on the Heritage Office Internet and Intranet and circulated to all staff.

The plan will identify personal information held by the office, obligations of employees, guidelines for the storage and dissemination and procedures for lodging complaints and or internal reviews.

The Heritage Office has received no applications to access personal information in terms of this legislation.

## Risk Management and Insurance

The Heritage Office carries a comprehensive range of insurance cover through the Treasury Managed Fund covering property, public liability, motor vehicle, workers compensation and other contingencies. This cover has few exclusions. The annual premium is paid for the current year and this arrangement of self insurance is reviewed periodically to ensure that it remains adequate. The policy is managed by the GIO.

The office covers no officers professional liability insurance, but officers are covered by a State indemnity against claims not involving negligence, due to the public service employee status.

In 2000 the Heritage Office developed a Business Continuity and Disaster Recovery Plan. This plan is scheduled for review in late 2002 in line with the move of the Heritage Office to the former King's School, Parramatta.

## **Waste Management**

The office continued to implement measures under its Waste Reduction and Purchasing Plan.

Some of the initiatives being implemented in this plan include: the use of recycled paper where possible; the expansion of the use of the electronic office; the recycling of all waste paper and cardboard.

All free publications are available for download on the Internet. This has considerably reduced the need for large printing orders by over 50%. Similarly, e-mail and the intranet have replaced local paper copies of internal policies and manuals.

## **Government Energy Management**

Government agencies are required to establish an energy management plan and to report energy consumption. This requirement is necessary under the Government's Greenhouse Action Plan.

The Heritage Office uses electricity for its office accommodation and fuel for its vehicle fleet.

The Heritage Office will relocate to the former King's School in Parramatta in late 2002 and is currently undertaking an adaptive re-use of the property which will incorporate the latest energy management technology.

Overall cost of electricity consumption was \$9,132.

The office has a pool of two modern and fuel efficient vehicles using unleaded fuel. All vehicles are purchased through the State Contract. The office's total fuel consumption was 8,850 litres.

## **Credit Card Certification**

The Heritage Office holds three corporate credit cards. The use of these cards are governed by Treasury Regulations and the Heritage Office Corporate Credit Card Policy.
