WHEREAS the Parliament of New South Wales has been called together for the despatch of business on Tuesday, the fifth day of June instant; and whereas it is deemed expedient for divers urgent and weighty reasons that it should be further prorogued: Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM, EARL BEAUCHAMP, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Parliament until Tuesday, the twelfth day of June instant: And I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the said Parliament shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid twelfth day of June instant, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Council Chambers, situate in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney; and the members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Government House, Sydney, this first day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-third year of her Majesty's reign.

# PUBLIC STATUTES OF THE SESSION.

EIGHTEENTH PARLIAMENT—FIFTH SESSION.

## ADMINISTRATION VALIDATING ACT (63 VIC. No. 38)—

An Act to validate certain orders of the Supreme Court giving power or leave to sell, mortgage, or lease real estate of deceased persons and all acts done in pursuance thereof; to validate certain sales, mortgages, and leases of such estate; to provide for the granting of power to sell, mortgage, or lease such estate; and to authorise the postponement of the realisation of any estate of any such person used in any business, trade, or occupation, and the continuation of the use of the same for those purposes, and the carrying on of the said business, trade, or occupation. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wise, 13 September, 1900. Assented to 26 October, 1900.]

## APPROPRIATION ACT (66 VIC. No. 59)—

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1900, to the 30th day of June, 1901, inclusive of both dates, and to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1899-1900," for supplementary charges during the period from the 1st day of July, 1899, to the 30th day of June, 1900, inclusive of both dates, and to cover payments charged to "Expenditure Suspense Account" for services of the year 1898-9; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Sir William Lyne, 29 November, 1900. Assented to, 1st December, 1900.]

## ART UNIONS ACT AMENDMENT ACT (64 VIC. No. 4)—

An Act to amend the Art Unions Act of 1850. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. W. J. Trickett, 27 June, 1900. Assented to, 3 August, 1900.]

## ATTACHMENT OF WAGES LIMITATION ACT (64 VIC. No. 6)—

An Act to limit the attachment of wages. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 20 June, 1900. Assented to, 17 August, 1900.]

## BANKS HALF-HOLIDAY ACT (64 VIC. No. 80)—

An Act to enable banks and branch banks to be closed on certain afternoons; to provide that such afternoons shall not be banking or business hours for the purpose of any business at such banks and branches; and to amend the Bills of Exchange Act, 1887. [Initiated in the Assembly by Sir William Lyne, 30 November, 1900. Assented to, 11 December, 1900.]

## BOUNDARY STREET ACT (64 VIC. No. 58)—

An Act to vest certain land in the Metropolitan Board of Water Supply and Sewerage, and to vest certain other land in the Municipal Council of Sydney for the purpose of constructing and opening thereon a public way, with certain powers to sell and lease the said lands; and to include the said lands within the city of Sydney. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. O'Sullivan, 15 November, 1900. Assented to, 30 November, 1900.]

## BYROCK TO BREWARRINA RAILWAY AMENDMENT ACT (64 VIC. No. 11)—

An Act to amend the Byrock to Brewarrina Railway Act, 1898, and the Public Works Act of 1888. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. O'Sullivan, 24 July, 1900. Assented to, 4 September, 1900.]

## CASINO TO LISMORE RAILWAY ACT (64 VIC. No. 14)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of Railway from Casino to Lismore; to authorise the construction of the said line on public roads; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. O'Sullivan, 27 July, 1900. Assented to, 15 September, 1900.]

## CENSUS ACT (64 VIC. No. 65)—

An Act to make provision for taking the Census of New South Wales in the year 1901, and for obtaining certain statistics, and certain particulars relating to live stock and crops, and the occupation of land, and certain businesses and occupations for the said and subsequent years; and for purposes incidental to or consequent on the aforesaid objects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. See, 23 November, 1900. Assented to, 5 December, 1900.]

## CHILDREN'S PROTECTION ACT AMENDMENT ACT (64 VIC. No. 52)—

An Act to amend and extend the Children's Protection Act, 1892. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Neild, 12 July, 1900. Assented to, 19 November, 1900.]

## CHURCH AND SCHOOL LANDS AMENDMENT ACT (64 VIC. No. 62)—

An Act to provide for the application of the money derived from certain securities and interest in respect of the same; and to amend the Church and School Lands Act, 1897. [Initiated in the Assembly by Sir William Lyne, 15 November, 1900. Assented to, 5 December, 1900.]



**CITY RAILWAY EXTENSION (DEVONSHIRE-STREET) ACT (64 VIC. NO. 83)—**

An Act to sanction the extension of the railway from its present terminus at Redfern to the north of Devonshire-street, and the construction there of a commodious station and administrative offices; and for purposes consequent upon and incidental to those objects.
