# PUBLIC STATUTES OF THE SESSION.

TWENTY-FOURTH PARLIAMENT—THIRD SESSION.

## APPROPRIATION ACT (GEO. V, No. 24, 1918)—

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain Sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1918, to the 30th day of June, 1919 (inclusive of both dates); to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer," 1917-18, Consolidated Revenue Fund, for supplementary charges during the period from the 1st day of July, 1917, to the 30th day of June, 1918 (inclusive of both dates); to cover payments "Unauthorised in Suspense," Consolidated Revenue Fund, for urgent claims on account of Services of the year 1917-18; to provide for Public Works and other Services out of the Public Works Fund; and to provide for Services out of the Closer Settlement Fund; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. J. C. L. Fitzpatrick, 25 September, 1918. Assented to, 28 September, 1918.]

## AUDIT (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 18, 1918)—

An Act to amend the Audit Act, 1902. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. J. C. L. Fitzpatrick, 28 June, 1918. Assented to, 17 July, 1918.]

## BIRDS AND ANIMALS PROTECTION ACT (GEO. V, No. 21, 1918)—

An Act to provide for the protection of certain animals and birds; to repeal the Birds Protection Act, 1901, and the Native Animals Protection Act, 1903; to amend certain other Acts; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Council by Hon. J. Garland, 19 June, 1918. Assented to, 12 September, 1918.]

## CLOSER SETTLEMENT (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 48, 1918)—

An Act to amend the law relating to closer settlement and to settlement purchases; to provide for the transfer of certain securities, moneys, powers, rights, and claims from the Government Savings Bank to the Minister for Lands; to provide a basis of valuation in certain cases of resumption of land; to repeal the Closer Settlement Promotion Act, 1910; to amend the Acts relating to closer settlement, the Government Savings Bank Act, 1906, the Constitution Act, 1902, and certain other Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. Ashford, 3 October, 1918. Assented to, 21 December, 1918.]

## COMPANIES REGISTRATION OF SECURITIES ACT (GEO. V, No. 37, 1918)—

An Act to amend the law relating to companies; to provide for the registration of certain securities; to amend the Companies Act, 1899, the Bills of Sale Act of 1898, and certain other Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. D. R. Hall, 3 October, 1918. Assented to, 12 December, 1918.]

## CRIMES (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 35, 1918)—

An Act to facilitate the proof of certain matters in certain cases of larceny; to amend the Crimes Act, 1900; and for matters consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Council by Hon. J. Garland, 19 June, 1918. Assented to, 3 December, 1918.]

## CROWN LAND LEASES WITHDRAWAL ACT (GEO. V, No. 29, 1918)—

An Act to provide that during the present war, and for a certain period thereafter, the compensation payable for improvements on land withdrawn from leases under the Crown Lands Acts shall not exceed a certain amount; and for other purposes. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. Ashford, 3 October, 1918. Assented to, 26 November, 1918.]

**FIRST OFFENDERS (WOMEN) ACT (GEO. V, No. 1, 1919)—**

An Act to make further provision with regard to the hearing of certain charges against women first offenders and the publication of reports of proceedings in such cases; to amend the Supreme Court and Circuit Courts (Amendment) Act, 1912, the Justices Act, 1902, and certain other Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. D. R. Hall, 5 December, 1918.]

**GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS (SUPERANNUATION AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 30, 1918)—**

An Act to amend the law relating to certain superannuation rights; to provide that certain transferred officers and employees be deemed to have been appointed, as from a certain date, permanent officers; to amend the Government Railways Act, 1912, and the Government Railways (Amendment) Act, 1916; and for purposes incidental thereto or consequent thereon. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. Ball 7 November, 1918. Assented to, 27 November, 1918.]

**INCOME-TAX ACT (GEO. V, No. 28, 1918)—**

An Act to increase the amount of the income-tax payable in the year 1919; and for that purpose to amend certain Acts. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. J. C. L. Fitzpatrick, 29 October, 1918. Assented to, 21 November, 1918.]

**INCOME-TAX MANAGEMENT (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 27, 1918)—**

An Act to amend the law with regard to the assessment and collection of a tax on incomes; to amend the Income-tax (Management) Act, 1912, the Income-tax Management (Amendment) Act, 1914, and the Income-tax Management (Further Amendment) Act, 1914; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. J. C. L. Fitzpatrick, 17 October, 1918. Assented to, 15 November, 1918.]

**INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION (FURTHER AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 39, 1918)—**

An Act to further amend the law for the regulation of the conditions of industries and industrial arbitration; to provide for the appointment of additional commissioners of the Board of Trade to represent rural industries; to amend the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912, the Industrial Arbitration (Amendment) Act, 1916, and the Industrial Arbitration (Amendment) Act, 1918; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. Beeby, 9 October, 1918. Assented to, 12 December, 1918.]

**IRRIGATION (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 38, 1918)—**

An Act to make further provision with regard to irrigation and irrigation areas; to vest certain powers, rights, and property in the Commission; to validate the constitution of certain areas and the reduction of certain debts to the Crown; to amend the Murrumbidgee Irrigation Act, 1910, the Irrigation Act, 1912, the Irrigation (Amendment) Act, 1916, the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913, the Crown Lands Amendment Act, 1916, the Water Act, 1912, the Hay Irrigation Act, 1902, the Real Property Act, 1900, and certain other Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. Grahame, 3 October, 1918. Assented to, 12 December, 1918.]

**JURY (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 33, 1918)—**

An Act to exempt certain commercial travellers and mining managers from serving upon a jury; and to amend the Jury Act, 1912. [Initiated in Council by Hon. J. Garland, 12 September, 1918. Assented to, 3 December, 1918.]

**JUSTICES (BAIL) AMENDMENT ACT (GEO. V, No. 32, 1918)—**

An Act to authorise certain persons to grant bail to persons in custody; to amend the Police Offences Act, 1901, the Police Offences (Amendment) Act, 1908, and the Justices Act, 1902; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Council by Hon. J. Garland, 12 September, 1918. Assented to, 3 December, 1918.]

**LAW OF EVIDENCE (*pro forma*)—**

[Initiated in Assembly by Mr. Holman, 12 June, 1918; in the Council by Hon. J. Garland, 12 June, 1918.]



**LIQUOR (REFUND OF RENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 45, 1918)—**

An Act to make provision for certain refunds being made in the rents of licensed premises; to amend the Liquor Act, 1912, and the Liquor (Amendment) Act, 1916; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. D. R. Hall, 5 December, 1918. Assented to, 19 December, 1918.]

**LOAN ACT (GEO. V, No. 25, 1918)—**

An Act to authorise the raising of a Loan for Public Works and Services; and for other purposes. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. J. C. L. Fitzpatrick, 26 September, 1918. Assented to, 8 October, 1918.]

**MINING (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 41, 1918)—**

An Act to amend the law relating to mining; to amend the Mining Act, 1906, and the Acts relating to Crown lands; to make further provision for mining on private lands; to deal with certain mining titles; to provide for entry into certain lands; to provide that employees may remove or sell certain buildings and improvements; to provide for the resumption of land for mining villages; and for other purposes. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. J. C. L. Fitzpatrick, 10 July, 1918. Assented to, 18 December, 1918.]

**PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 40, 1918)—**

An Act to amend the law relating to parliamentary elections; to provide for a system of proportional representation, and for postal voting in certain cases; to validate the non-preparation of certain lists and rolls, and to provide that the rolls for the year 1917 shall, until new rolls are made, remain in force; to amend the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912, the Liquor Act, 1912, the Oaths Act, 1900, and certain other Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. Fuller, 3 December, 1918. Assented to, 18 December, 1918.]

**PASTURES PROTECTION (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 49, 1918)—**

An Act to make further provision for the protection of pastures; to provide for the control of certain travelling stock and camping reserves; to make further provision with regard to boundary fences; to provide for the imposition and collection of a rate on travelling stock; to establish a reserve improvement fund; to validate certain payments made by pastures protection boards; to amend the Pastures Protection Act, 1912, the Crown Lands Acts, and certain other Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. Grahame, 20 November, 1918. Assented to, 21 December, 1918.]

**POLICE INQUIRY ACT (GEO. V, No. 19, 1918)—**

An Act to appoint a commissioner to make inquiry relating to certain charges made against certain members of the New South Wales Police Force; to confer certain powers, rights, privileges, and immunities upon such commissioner; to apply the provisions of the Royal Commissioners Evidence Act, 1901, and the Boorabil Commission Act, 1914, to such inquiry; to amend those Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.
