Contempt—Suspension of Member: A member was guilty of a wilful and vexatious breach of the Standing Orders in declining to act as teller in a division without being excused, 3596, 3603.

Corridor Tram Cars: A motion of adjournment to discuss the question whether new tram cars proposed to be constructed by the Railways Commissioners should be corridor cars did not convey the meaning of the mover and should be withdrawn, 1222.

Disorder in Galleries: obs., 4091.

Disposal of City Garbage: An adjournment motion to discuss "The action of the Civic Commissioners in emptying garbage into the sea" was not a definite matter, but was in form an ordinary motion asking the House to express an opinion on a certain matter and was not within the rules relating to motions under Standing Order 49, 1143.

Fair Rents Bill: A motion to recommit the bill after the motion for the adoption of the report had been moved could not be accepted. This was one of the stages to which the notice relating to the allocation of business applied, 1175.

Government Railways Amendment (Officers) Bill: Mr. Speaker was not satisfied that certain amendments made at the instance of the Minister in charge of the bill were such as were not covered by the message from the Governor, and therefore would not rule that the bill was out of order, 3368.

"Hansard" Staff: obs., 223, 475.

Hon. Members and Questions: obs., 4020.

Income Tax Bill: Ordinarily a resolution of the House could only be rescinded during the same session after seven days' notice, but certain resolutions which did not come within the operation of Standing Order 188 were expressly provided for. Standing Order 333 contemplated a case where a resolution from Committee of Ways and Means might be recommitted, 2862.

The motion before the House that the debate be adjourned" was not comprehended within the various stages of the bill of which notice had been given under

Standing Order 175B, and therefore the Speaker must hold that the question "That the question be now put" was put under Standing Order 175 and must carry the procedure on under that Standing Order, 2871.

Income Tax (Management) Bill: The amendments made by the Legislative Council in this bill were clearly of a substantial character and did not come within the category of amendments which had from time to time been accepted as amendments to make clear and more definite the intention of the Assembly. Nor were they of the class in respect of which the House was entitled to waive its insistence or its privileges under Standing Order 287. Neither did they come within the instances cited in "May," 11th Edition, page 576. No stronger case of infringement of the privileges of the Assembly in respect of money bills had ever been made or attempted, 2604.

Land Lease to A. F. Crockett: It was sometimes extremely difficult to distinguish between a personal explanation and a Ministerial statement. In this case the Minister had gone beyond a personal explanation and the leader of the Opposition had the right of reply, but must confine himself to any new matter raised by the Minister, 3027.

Living Wage: An adjournment motion to discuss a pronouncement of Mr. Justice Piddington as to the living wage was not out of order on the ground that the matter was *sub judice*, 1529.

Personal Explanation: A member was not permitted to reply to statements made by another member, except in so far as he had been misrepresented, 1073.

Sitting Days and Hours: It was clear that the Deputy-Speaker was right in ruling that the House having resolved "That the question be now put," it was obligatory on him to put the original question, even though the time allotted for business by the sessional orders had expired, 3577, 3590; where there was a conflict between a sessional order and a standing order, the latter must prevail, 3578.
