WHEREAS the Parliament of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Wednesday, the twenty-sixth day of June instant: Now, I, FREDERIC JOHN NAPIER, BARON CHELMSFORD, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said State, do hereby further prorogue the said Parliament<sup>er</sup> to Tuesday, the twenty-third day of July next: And I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the said Parliament shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid twenty-third day of July next, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Legislative Council Chambers, situate in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney: And the members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, respectively, are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Sydney, this eighteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and in the third year of his Majesty's reign.

# PUBLIC STATUTES OF THE SESSION.

TWENTY-SECOND PARLIAMENT—FOURTH SESSION.

## APPROPRIATION ACT (No. 2) (3 GEO. V, No. 50, 1912)—

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1912, to the 30th day of June, 1913 (inclusive of both dates); to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer," 1911-12, Consolidated Revenue Fund, for supplementary charges during the period from the 1st day of July, 1911, to the 30th day of June, 1912 (inclusive of both dates), to cover payments "Unauthorised in Suspense," Consolidated Revenue Fund, for urgent claims on account of services of the year 1911-12; to provide for public works and other services out of the Public Works Fund; and to provide for services out of the Closer Settlement Fund; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Cann, 26 November, 1912. Assented to, 30 November, 1912.]

## BANKS AND BANK HOLIDAYS ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 43, 1912)—

An Act to consolidate the laws relating to banks and bank holidays. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 August, 1912. Assented to, 26 November, 1912.]

## BELLEVUE HILL LINE TO BONDI BEACH TRAMWAY ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 67, 1912)—

An Act to sanction the construction of an electric tramway from the Bellevue Hill line to Bondi Beach; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 2 December, 1912. Assented to, 20 December, 1912.]

## BROADMEADOW-WARATAH TRAMWAY ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 68, 1912)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of tramway from Broadmeadow to Waratah; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 2 December, 1912. Assented to, 20 December, 1912.]

## CARELESS USE OF FIRE ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 28, 1912)—

An Act to consolidate the Acts relating to the prevention of the careless use of fire. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 August, 1912. Assented to, 26 November, 1912.]

## CARRINGTON BRIDGE REMOVAL ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 60, 1912)—

An Act to extinguish any right-of-way over the Carrington Bridge, at Newcastle, and its approaches; to provide for the removal of the said bridge and approaches; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 2 December, 1912. Assented to, 20 December, 1912.]

## CLAIMS AGAINST THE GOVERNMENT AND CROWN SUITS ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 27, 1912)—

An Act for consolidating enactments relating to claims against the Government and Crown suits. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 August, 1912. Assented to, 26 November, 1912.]

## CLOSER SETTLEMENT (AMENDMENT) ACT (No. 2) (3 GEO. V, No. 74, 1912)—

An Act to provide for the resumption of certain leases, and for the disposal of the lands comprised therein; to amend the law in respect of the payments to be made as instalments of and interest on purchase money for settlement purchases; to amend the Crown Lands Acts, the Closer Settlement Acts, the Closer Settlement Promotion Act, 1910, and the Public Works and Closer Settlement Funds Act, 1906, in certain respects; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Beeby, 26 November, 1912. Assented to, 20 December, 1912.]

## COAL MINES REGULATION ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 37, 1912)—

An Act to consolidate enactments relating to the regulation of coal-mines and collieries. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 August, 1912. Assented to, 26 November, 1912.]

## CONDOBOLIN TO BROKEN HILL RAILWAY ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 64, 1912)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Condobolin to Broken Hill; to authorise the construction of the said line on public roads; to amend the Public Works Act, 1900, as far as it relates to the making and maintaining of fences along the said line; to provide for the use of the said line by the constructing authority or by persons authorised by him; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 16 October, 1912. Assented to, 20 December, 1912.]

**CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND AND PUBLIC WORKS FUND ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 18, 1912)—**

An Act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund towards the services of the year 1912-1913, and out of the Public Works Fund; and for services to be hereafter provided for by loan. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Cann, 24 July, 1912. Assented to, 2 August, 1912.]

**CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND AND PUBLIC WORKS FUND ACT (No. 2) (3 GEO. V, No. 20, 1912)—**

An Act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund towards the services of the year 1912-1913; and out of the Public Works Fund; and for services to be hereafter provided for by loan. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Cann, 25 September, 1912. Assented to 1 October, 1912.]

**CORONERS ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 36, 1912)—**

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to coroners' inquests, and to magisterial inquiries into the cause of death. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 August, 1912. Assented to 26 November, 1912.]

**CROWN LANDS (AMENDING AND DECLARATORY) ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 53, 1912)—**

An Act to correct anomalies, reconcile discrepancies, supply omissions, and amend in certain respects (for the purpose of facilitating the consolidation thereof) the Acts regulating the alienation, occupation, and management of Crown lands; to declare the treaty-rights of aliens to be saved for the purposes of the said Acts; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Beeby, 14 August, 1912. Assented to, 4 December, 1912.]

**DEFAMATION ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 32, 1912)—**

An Act to consolidate the statutes relating to defamation. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 August, 1912. Assented to, 26 November, 1912.]

**DENTISTS ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 26, 1912)—**

An Act to consolidate the statutes providing for the registration of dentists qualified to practise in New South Wales. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 August, 1912. Assented to, 26 November, 1912.]

**DISTRICT COURTS ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 23, 1912)—**

An Act to consolidate enactments relating to District Courts. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 August, 1912. Assented to, 23 November, 1912.]

**DUBBO SEWERAGE ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 63, 1912)—**

An Act to sanction the carrying out of a scheme of sewerage for the municipality of Dubbo; and for purposes consequent thereon and incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 2 December, 1912. Assented to, 20 December, 1912.]

**FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT (No. 2), (3 GEO. V, No. 39, 1912)—**

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to the supervision and regulation of factories, bakehouses, laundries, dyeworks, and shops; the limitation in certain cases of the hours of working therein; the extension of the liability of employers for injuries suffered by employees in certain cases; the making provision for a minimum wage for certain persons, and for the payment of overtime and tea-money; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 November, 1912. Assented to, 26 November, 1912.]

**FRIENDLY SOCIETIES ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 46, 1912)—**

An Act to consolidate the Acts relating to friendly societies. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 November, 1912. Assented to, 26 November, 1912.]

**FRIENDLY SOCIETIES (AMENDMENT) ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 1, 1913)—**

An Act to amend the Friendly Societies (Amendment) Act, 1906. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. F. Flowers, 8 November, 1911. Assented to, 7 January, 1913.]

**FRUIT CASES ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 72, 1912)—**

An Act to regulate the size and description of cases used in the sale and export of fruit, and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Træfle, 7 August, 1912. Assented to, 20 December, 1912.]

**GAMING AND BETTING ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 25, 1912)—**

An Act to consolidate the Acts relating to games, wagers, and betting-houses; the restriction of race-meetings; the licensing of racecourses; and allied matters. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 7 August, 1912. Assented to, 26 November, 1912.]

**GAS ACT (3 GEO. V, No. 71, 1912)—**

An Act to prescribe standards of illuminating power, purity, and pressure for gas; to regulate the price of gas; to regulate companies, corporations, firms, and persons supplying gas, and particularly with regard to dividends, reserves, funds, accounts, and the issue of shares; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. *Address in Reply:* It was a time-honored custom in the House of Commons to dispose of the address in reply before proceeding with other business, and the sessional orders giving precedence to general business on Tuesday would not interfere with the address in reply being dealt with on that day, 101; the Government were not responsible for the action of the Speaker in relation to the Assembly staff, 117; it was irregular for a member to cast reflections on a member of the other House, 139; it was out of order to impute untruthfulness to a member, 162; or to make improper imputations, 166; any document before the House might be referred to, 166; if a member took no notice of interjections the House would not notice them unless they were disorderly, 185; it was disorderly to interrupt a member and make little speeches, 197; or to stop a speech to ask a question, 238; great latitude was allowed to members in debating the Governor's speech, 198; anything said by members in the House could be accepted because members were on their honor, but the House knew nothing of what was said outside, 202; the House did not insist on a member vouching for the truth of every statement he made, 205; members were at liberty to make short, pointed interjections, but not to keep up a running fire that would interfere with debate, 213; members never knowingly made untrue statements, 219; it was out of order to refer to a report of the Public Works Committee as rotten and corrupt, 223; the King's name should not be brought into debate to influence a decision of the House, 245; a member must not occupy the attention of the House with his personal business, 303; it was a great insult to the House for a member to leave the Chamber while his conduct was under review, 309.

*Adjournment:* A motion to discuss the Rookwood-Bankstown railway inquiry was out of order, seeing that the motion referred to a royal commission which had not been appointed 367; members must be strictly confined to the one subject, which must be a definite matter of urgent public importance, 376, 441, 483, 543, 650, 705, 1061, 1352; it was most improper to talk of a practice of the House being a disgrace to Parliament, 645; the Speaker was at liberty to lay upon the table a report, or make a statement at any time, 653; it was part of the Speaker's duty to see that the business paper was in order and distributed, 654; members should

be more considerate than to interject when a time limit was imposed, 1306; there was no provision for granting an extension of time on an adjournment motion, 1311; it was unparliamentary to refer to a member as a "rebel" or a "lickspittle," 1317; or a "jackal," 1521; or to say "that a member should be taken out and shot," 1321; the courtesy was due to every member to allow him to finish his argument, even though the time limit might be exceeded by a minute or two, 1325; a motion of adjournment to discuss the delay in making advances to settlers was out of order in so far as it would anticipate debate on an order of the day, the Valuation of Land Bill, 1353; a motion of adjournment to discuss the delay in the issue of the daily *Hansard* was out of order, as the question was not one which should occupy the attention of Parliament, 1530; the question of urgency was determined by five members rising in their places, and the only thing the Speaker could do was to confine the debate to the subject of the motion, 2265; a Minister could not mislead the House—the House would not permit that to be done, 2380; it was out of order to say that parliamentary procedure was being turned into a travesty, 2381; members could not on the motion for the adjournment of the House discuss a question the debate on which had been adjourned to another day, 3355; a motion of adjournment to discuss the provision for votes to shire councils for road-making purposes was out of order, seeing that the subject had already been discussed, 3915.

*Appropriation Bill, No. 2:* Grievances could be aired before supply was granted—until the Appropriation Bill was passed, 3822; at the third reading stage the bill was properly before the House even though some portions of it might be in writing, 3827.

*Bell, Madame, Claims of:* It was not incumbent on the member moving the adoption of the report of the select committee to go through the evidence to prove the contentions summed up in the report, 2670.

*Biograph Entertainments:* A motion to discuss the proposed new regulations relating to biograph entertainments was in order, because, even though the matter could be discussed on the estimates, that would not prevent the regulations from coming into operation, 3484; when a motion was stated to the House, it became the property of the House, which could adjourn the debate even on an urgency motion, 3561.

*Censure Motion—Mr. Nielsen's Appointment:* A member was at liberty to quote from any publication of last year or last session, 825, 841; the House would take no notice of pairs, 846, 850; preference was always given in the Speaker's call to mem-

bers who were opposing a motion, 860; when a member insulted the Chair he was invariably suspended for a week in the House of Commons, 860.

*Coal Mines Eight Hours Bill*: It was not regular to reflect on the deliberations of members in another place, 2965; a member in opposition to a bill had the first claim to be heard, 2970; it was contrary to parliamentary practice to bring up for discussion on the third reading something said by an advocate of the bill on the second reading, or to discuss the bill in detail, 3090.

*Coal Mines Regulation (Amendment) Bill*: If a member cared to hazard a question, and a Minister chose to answer it, well and good, but it was out of order to stop a member who was addressing the House, 1250; a member interjecting from the Government front benches was grossly out of order; a private member rising from such a position to address the House would not be seen, 1253.

*Consolidation Bills*: Nothing unfair could be done by Parliament, 2923.

*Crown Lauds—Residence Conditions*: A motion dealing with this subject was in order, even though the estimates had been brought down since the debate had been adjourned, 2406.

*Crown, Message from*: A message from the Crown took precedence of all other business, and if there were not a quorum present the reading of a message would make a House, 2325.

*Divisions*: A member was at liberty to refuse to act as the teller, but not, when refusing, to be offensive to the House, 496.

*Disorder*: There was no precedent in the records of the Parliament in which a member had used offensive words to the Chairman when being removed, but such a case had occurred in the House of Commons, and the offending member had been suspended; an apology accepted by the Chairman of Committees was not necessarily sufficient, 2263; there could be no discussion on a motion declaring a member, who had been named, guilty of contempt; refusing to tell on a division was no discourtesy to the Chair; if no members were willing to act as tellers for the noes the motion would pass in the affirmative, 3431; without a division, 3344; a member must not insult the Speaker by describing a complaint by him as "petulant," 3346, 3415; the House was paramount as to its own affairs, 3347; when a member was called on to retire, he was supposed to leave, not only the Chamber, but the precincts of the House, 3347; it was the practice for a member who had been named to speak in explanation after the motion declaring his contempt had been moved—it was quite as frequent for a

member to speak after as before; if the member failed to take the opportunity offered, and a motion for his suspension were tabled, he should retire, 3375; members addressing the House must respect the dignity and prestige of Parliament—it was not the Speaker in the chair as an individual, but the institution he represented which must be respected, 3390; when a member who has been named had made his explanation he should retire, 3407; a member must not cast reflections on parliamentary procedure, 3424; it was grossly out of order to interfere with an officer of the House, 3454; the Speaker, having directed a member to put his withdrawal and apology in writing, that direction must be complied with before a motion could be moved declaring the verbal apology and withdrawal satisfactory—it would be necessary to first move for the rescission of the motion calling for an apology and withdrawal, 3456; a suspension of the standing orders would not be sufficient to enable the motion to be reached; notice must be given of a motion to dissent from the Speaker's ruling; the House knew nothing about the Cabinet; when the House had once expressed its desire, there must be seven days' grace before a rescissory motion could be passed, 3456, 3479; the Speaker retained his rights as a member, and a motion could not be taken "with concurrence" if the Speaker objected, 3457; a question of privilege was something that would not keep till to-morrow; a motion to suspend the standing orders to consider the ruling of the Speaker could not be entertained, 3458; a member inciting others to physical violence against the Speaker was liable to be taken clean away to the lock-up, 3478; the decision of the Chair at the moment it was given, whether right or wrong must be obeyed and upheld by the House, 3480; the conduct of the Speaker was protected from sudden challenge, and if a motion was intended to express want of confidence in the Speaker notice must be given, 3480; a resolution declaring that a member's withdrawal and apology were satisfactory was not as strong as a standing order, which must have the approval of the Crown, but as a temporary expedient it would stand good, 3483.

*Ellis, William John*: On the motion for the adoption of the report of a select committee it was not competent for members to go into the details of the evidence, 2270; it was an offence for a private member to sit on the front Ministerial bench and interject, 2272.

*Gas Bill*: If members wished to hazard a question they might interject when the Minister was moving the second reading, but the Minister should not be pulled up and asked a question, 765; members could not quote the statements of newspapers on

**SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.):** the bill, 780; counsel appearing at the bar of the House must confine their addresses to the business side of the question, and must not discuss the policy of the measure which was in the hands of the representatives of the people, 890; the putting of questions to counsel was irregular, 891; the conduct of the House was in the Speaker's charge; a member was in order in reading quotations from newspapers, 963.

**Governor's Opening Speech:** It was not necessary to read the speech in the Assembly, 18; a notice of motion to dissent from Mr. Speaker's ruling that it was not necessary to read the speech was out of order, and a member persisting in repeating the same notice of motion was most disorderly, 93.

**Greater Sydney Convention Bill:** The bill was properly before the House, 1985, 1987.

**Hansard Reports:** There could be only one recognised leader of the minority in the House; the leader of the Opposition had no status whatever; it was a matter of privilege and not a right when he spoke for the Opposition, 582.

**Height of Buildings Bill:** It was a breach of the rules for a member to walk about the Chamber and converse in a loud tone, 3215; it was most reprehensible for a member to turn his back on the Chair to carry on a conversation, 3217; members desiring to propose amendments must write legibly, and must be prepared to propose business to the House, 3026.

**Hospitals, State Aid for:** On a motion to grant financial support to hospitals which were open to the poor free of charge, a member was not justified in raising the sectarian question, 719, 725; when the Speaker rose a member must be seated—he must not be disrespectful to the Chair and must not reflect on a direction given from the Chair, 719, 720, 731; an amendment providing that the conditions of the Hospitals Act should be conformed to, was in order, 721; members had no right to sit on the Government benches and interject, 739; no amendment could be proposed after a later part of the question had been amended or proposed to be amended, unless the proposed amendment were withdrawn; an amendment essentially the same as one disposed of could not be entertained, 739.

**Industrial Arbitration Act:** Where business was taken in sections it was not necessary in Committee for the whole matter to be read, 2170.

**Irrigation Bill, No. 2:** It was not part of the Speaker's duty to hinder business; there was no very great stringency in formal matters, and nearing the end of a session it was in accordance with practice to set aside an objection to a formal motion, 3192.

**ASSEMBLY (continued):**

**SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.):** *Legal Practitioners (Amendment) Bill:* Members could not discuss the land scandals, 1168, 1203; or review the powers or decisions of the High Court, 1170, 1177, 1191, 1195; or discuss the Dean case, 1171; a bill was not necessarily a private bill because it was introduced by a private member; in a case of doubt, the Speaker, and not the House, decided whether a bill was public or private, 1207; the bill was ruled in order, but the question as to whether it were a public or private measure could be raised again at a later stage, 1208; the bill was properly before the House, 1591; it was not permissible to read quotations from members' speeches, 1598.

**Licensed Victuallers: Commission of the Peace:** A motion condemning the exclusion of licensed victuallers from the commission of the peace was in order, and would not anticipate discussion on a consolidating liquor bill, 1356.

**Ministerial Statements:** When a Ministerial statement was made for the information of the House, it was open to the leader of the Opposition to say a few words if he so desired, 1299, 1529; a Minister could not refer to a statement in a newspaper, as the House had nothing to do with what appeared in the press; he could refer to a paper laid on the table, 1528; in replying to a Ministerial statement the leader of the Opposition must adhere as closely as possible to the statement of facts without argument, 3123; there could be no reply to a statement of a Minister on a question of honor, 3192.

**Nielsen, Mr.:** It was not competent to discuss the merits of a notice of motion in moving that it should be treated as a matter of urgency, 2754.

**No-Confidence Motion:** The actions of a member of the Upper House could not be discussed, 2342; to say that an offensive expression was used in a political or Pickwickian sense did not justify it, 2352; it was unparliamentary and improper to say that a member had misled the House, or to impute dishonesty, 2374; it was out of order to use the name of the King or his representative for the purpose of influencing debate, 2377; or to refer to a Minister as disloyal, 2377; an amendment which sought to renew a question already decided was out of order, 2378.

**North Coast Railway Contracts:** The leader of the Opposition, in replying to a Ministerial statement, could not deliver an argumentative speech when there was nothing before the House, 581.

**Officers of the House** were under the control of the Speaker, 35.

**Opposition, Deputy Leader of:** The leader of the Opposition was within his right in asking a member to take up his work, 1352.

**SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF** (*ctd.*):

**Parliament House, Accommodation at:** Two speeches could not be made on the same question, but if an amendment became a substantive motion every member would have a right to speak, 2921.

**Parliamentary Representatives Allowance Bill:** An amendment to defer the second reading could not be entertained after the word "now" had been retained as the result of a negative vote on a proposal to omit it, 617.

**Pastures Protection Boards:** A motion for the abolition of stock boards in the coastal districts was out of order, because it would anticipate discussion on bills relating to such boards, 1354.

**Personal Explanation:** A personal explanation must be strictly confined to the personal side, and to the misrepresentation complained of, 441; a member must not introduce new matter, 482; a personal explanation must refer to one's own affair, not to what somebody else said, 641; a member whose honor was assailed was entitled to make a *personal* explanation, 1352.

**Placing of Business:** It was an offence for a member to leave the Chamber while the Speaker was on his feet, 2510.

**Postponement of Business:** It was irregular to single out motions, such as motions of want of confidence, without postponing the business placed before it on the notice-paper, 2326.

**Press Representatives, Accommodation for:** The Speaker must not be brought into the question, 929; a motion for the adoption of a new standing order providing for the accommodation of the press in the House was in order, 933; the proposal was not being brought forward as a Government proposal; it was the proposal of the House for the government of the House, 942; an amendment to refer the proposed standing order to the Standing Orders Committee was out of order, 953.

**Press Representatives, Exclusion of:** A member should not repeatedly put the same question or any question that was virtually the same as one previously asked, 808; the Speaker had his authority from the House; he was in the chair to carry out the will of Parliament, 812; the Speaker would take into consideration the expressed will of the House from time to time, 871.

**Privilege:** A member desiring to raise a question of privilege in regard to a newspaper report must mark the paragraphs and the sense of the House would then be taken as to whether they should be read; there could be no question with regard to privilege, 193; a motion relating to the impropriety of the chief of the *Hansard* Staff commenting on a notice of motion could be

dealt with at any time; a question of privilege was something that would not keep, 641; a question of privilege was one of great urgency, and took precedence of every other form of motion; notice must be given of a motion referring to the action of the *Hansard* clerk in commenting on notices of motion given by members, 747; a member offended against the House by calling another member a "polecat," and it was unparliamentary to refer to a member as one who "went to coffee-stalls and broke the crockery," 873; the object of marking and reading newspaper paragraphs which were alleged to constitute a breach of privilege was to confine members to the discussion of what was objected to; a leader of a party in the House who repeatedly broke the standing orders in defiance of the Chair was liable to be removed, 874; a member who was impudent to the Chair was out of order, as also was a member who commented discourteously on the directions of the Chair; the fact of a member commending or approving of what had been said in a newspaper did not make it privilege, 875; a member was not there to justify the press, but to prove that the article published was or was not a breach of privilege; a member must not state supposititious cases, or base offensive remarks on an *innuendo*; any charge against the Speaker must be a direct charge, 877; a false or perverted report of debates was a breach of privilege, 878; the head of the Government and the leader of the House was entitled to wider latitude than any other member, 879; the privileges of the House rested with the House, which decided questions of privilege; debate on another question must not be anticipated, 885.

**Public Trustee Bill:** The machinery of a bill could not be discussed at the second reading stage, when the debate must be confined to principles, 3149.

**Questions** would not be heard on the first day of the session, 17; questions must not be put twice, 35; the personal opinions of Ministers did not concern the House, and questions must relate to matters of public business, 36, 1048, 1300, 1457; there might be 5,000 questions on the standing orders, and every one would be out of order, 1049; more than two questions relating to the same subject would necessitate a member giving notice of motion, 1049; a member might be asked questions if he had charge of business or had a notice of motion on the paper, 1051; a question relating to the identity of a Minister with a person who had commented on interruptors at a public meeting, was out of order, 1351; questions with respect to public funerals were discouraged in the House of Commons, 2261; the name of the King must not be mentioned to influence debate, 2261; every

**SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.):** member was on his honor in the House and his statement must be accepted without reservation, 2261; it was only as a matter of courtesy that questions were answered, 2324; a question as to the attitude of the Government in reference to the Federal referenda did not concern the House and was out of order, 2508; it was out of order to ask a question and supply the answer, 2508; it was an offence to trifle with the House, 2511; it was out of order to repeat a question which had been answered, or to which an answer had been declined on the previous day, 2587; it was the privilege of the leader of a party to ask questions regarding the Government business of the session, 2662; what was said in the newspapers could not be brought into the deliberations of Parliament, 2747, 3061; a member of a select committee was privileged—as was also a member of Parliament, 2749; a member in asking a question could not condemn the operation of an act of Parliament, 2752; any argument on a question was out of order, 2752; members could not put two questions in succession, 2833; there could not be two or three questions on the same subject, 2884, 3820; trivialities relating to the working of the parliamentary establishment should not be brought into the House, but might be made the subject of representations to the Speaker, by interview or in writing, 2907; Mr. Speaker did not answer conundrums, 3821.

**Refreshment-room Committee:** It was beneath the dignity of the Speaker to sit under a chairman on a committee in a department where he was supposed to be supreme, 338; the report of the committee could be laid on the table, but no action could be taken until the Speaker, who wished to see it, had exercised that right, 747.

**Rocks Area, Administration of:** It was not usual to make attacks on members whose names were submitted for a select committee, 562.

**Rural Representation:** A motion in favour of more liberal representation for rural districts was in order, and would not anticipate discussion on the redistribution of seats scheme, 1774; it was no part of the duty of a member to do the agency work of his constituents, 2424.

**Savings Banks Amalgamation Bill:** It was unparliamentary to say that a member was as "shifty as a snake," 757; it was out of order to make a speech in detail on the third reading, 750; it was unparliamentary to charge members with having wasted the time of the House, 762.

**Shearers and Agricultural Labourers Accommodation Bill:** It was difficult to discuss the bill except in detail, but it was quite wrong that a bill should be so discussed on the second reading, 1548.

**ASSEMBLY (continued):**

**SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.):**

**Speaker, Mr., Insult to:** Members insulting Mr. Speaker in the vestibule were liable to be given in charge—members were not at liberty when outside the Chamber to behave in a manner that would not be permitted on the part of a stranger, 95.

**Speaker, Mr., Motion reflecting on:** It was not proper that a motion reflecting on the Speaker should be allowed to remain for an undue time on the business-paper—it should be disposed of without loss of time; a motion of this character so seldom appeared that no practice had been established, but there was such a thing as fairness and proper respect for the House, 1052; if a member could vouch for a statement made by the Speaker he could ask questions upon it, but if he wished to bring newspaper reports before the House he should raise a question of privilege, 1998.

**Speaker, Mr., Dissent from Ruling of:** A notice of motion of dissent could not be received, as it sought to renew a question already decided, 2585; a notice of motion of dissent from the Speaker's ruling as to the form in which questions should be addressed to Ministers was frivolous, and contrary to the standing orders, and therefore out of order, 2586. (See also *Disorder*, 3478.)

**Speaker, Mr., Want of Confidence in:** An affirmation by the House of its right to initiate and control through its members the business of the House had no relation to a motion of want of confidence in the Speaker, 3629; a motion against the Speaker must be in substantive form, so that his friends might be at liberty to amend it, 3631.

**Stock Brands Amendment Bill:** At the second reading stage only principles should be discussed, details should be left for the Committee, 520.

**Strangers, Accommodation of:** Every elector was entitled to a seat in the House, but as there was not room for every elector the people had to send their representatives, 924.

**Supply:** It was unusual to have a long debate on the question of suspending the standing orders, to permit supply to be granted, and the discussion must be confined strictly to the question before the House, 1463, 1467; it was not in order to say that the Speaker had sacrificed officers of the House, 1503.

**Sydney Corporation (Franchise) Bill:** A member must not notice interjections, which, if not noticed, would not appear in Hansard, 2433; a long debate on the motion for the adoption of the report would be most irregular, although the standing orders would permit of it, 2695.

**Taylor, J. A.:** A member, after addressing himself to a motion, could not move the adjournment of the debate, 2003.

*Valuation of Lands Bill* : When calling attention to the state of the House, a member was out of order in adding an observation, 2123.

*Wilkins, Alice* : It was a time-honored custom to permit a Minister to make a statement when laying important papers on the table, and to allow the leader of the Opposition to reply, 361.

*Yanco Settlement* : Papers tabled by a Minister became the property of the House, and if not printed remained in possession of the officials of the House and available to members, 3189.
