## ABATTOIR (SALE YARDS) CONSTRUCTION ACT (4 GEO. V No. 17, 1913)—

An act to sanction the construction of yards on the abattoir area at Homebush; for the disposition and sale of live stock; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 10 October, 1913. Assented to, 15 October, 1913.]

## COAL MINES REGULATION (AMENDING) ACT (4 GEO. V No. 11, 1913)—

An act to amend the Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1912; to bring certain persons under the Public Service Act, 1902; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 12 August, 1913. Assented to, 15 October, 1913.]

## COFF'S HARBOUR IMPROVEMENT ACT (4 GEO. V No. 10, 1913)—

An act to sanction the construction of certain breakwaters and jetties, and the carrying out of certain dredging at Coff's Harbour; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, Oct. 11, 1913. Assented to, 15 October, 1913.]

## COONABARABRAN TO BURREN JUNCTION RAILWAY ACT (4 GEO. V No. 12, 1913)—

An act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Coonabarabran to Burren Junction; to provide for the use of the said line by the constructing authority, or by persons authorised by him; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912; and for purposes consequent thereon and incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, October 1, 1913. Assented to, 15 October, 1913.]

## COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ASHFIELD LOAN AUTHORISATION ACT (4 GEO. V No. 6, 1913)—

An act to authorise the Council of the Municipality of Ashfield to borrow, upon certain conditions, the sum of thirty thousand pounds from the Australasian Temperance and General Mutual Life Assurance Society, Limited, notwithstanding the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1906, and the Local Government (Amending) Act, 1908, and the ordinances and regulations made thereunder, and for other purposes in connection therewith. [Initiated in Council by the Hon. D. R. Hall, 27 August, 1913. Assented to, 23 September, 1913.]

## CROWN LANDS CONSOLIDATION ACT (4 GEO. V No. 7, 1913)—

An act to consolidate the Crown Lands Acts and certain other acts or parts thereof dealing with the alienation, occupation, and management of Crown lands. [Initiated in Assembly by Mr. Trefle, 7 August, 1913. Assented to, 8 October, 1913.]

## DESERTED WIVES AND CHILDREN AMENDING ACT (4 GEO. V No. 9, 1913)—

An act to provide for the performance by prisoners committed under the Deserted Wives and Children Act, 1901, or under the Infant Protection Act, 1904, of certain work in prison; to amend the said acts, the Prisons Act, 1899, and the Neglected Children and Juvenile Offenders Act, 1905; and for purposes incidental thereto or consequent thereon.
