LAND ACQUISITION (JUST TERMS COMPENSATION) BILL (No. 2):

Clauses 1 to 23 having been dealt with,—

Clause 24.

### Hardship

- 24. (1) An authority of the State is not required to acquire land under this Division unless it is of the opinion that the owner will suffer hardship (within the meaning of this section) if there is any delay in the acquisition of the land under this Act.
  - (2) An owner of land suffers hardship if:
    - (a) the owner is unable to sell the land, or is unable to sell the land at its market value, because of the designation of the land for acquisition for a public purpose; and

- (b) it has become necessary for the owner to sell all or any part of the land without delay:
  - (i) for pressing personal, domestic or social reasons; or
  - (ii) in order to avoid the loss of (or a substantial reduction in) the owner's income.
- (3) However, if the owner of the land is a corporation to which this Division applies, the corporation does not suffer hardship unless it has become necessary for the corporation to sell all or any part of the land without delay:
  - (a) for pressing personal, domestic or social reasons of an individual who holds at least 20 per cent of the shares in the corporation; or
  - (b) in order to avoid the loss of (or a substantial reduction in) the income of such an individual.

[Read.]

Question proposed,—That the clause, as read, stand part of the Bill.

- 18. (1) The rent payable under a boarding agreement or a lodging agreement is not to be increased except by written notice given to the boarder or lodger which states:
  - (a) the amount of the increased rent; and
  - (b) the date from which it is payable, being a date that is not earlier than 10 days after the giving of the notice.
- (2) The rent payable under a boarding agreement or a lodging agreement that creates a tenancy for a fixed term is not to be increased during the term unless the amount of the increase, or a method of calculating the increase, is set out in the agreement.
- (3) An owner of a boarding house or a lodging house who fails to comply with subsection (1) or (2) in relation to a boarding agreement or a lodging agreement to which the owner is a party is guilty of an offence.

- (4) A notice given under this section may be cancelled by a later notice or a later notice may provide for a lesser increase than that specified in the earlier notice.
- (5) A later notice has effect instead of the earlier notice and takes effect from the date on which the earlier notice was to take effect.

- (6) If a notice taking effect under this section increases the rent payable under a boarding agreement or a lodging agreement, it operates to vary the agreement accordingly.
- (7) This section applies to a rent increase even if the amount, or a method of calculating the amount, of such an increase is a term of the boarding agreement or lodging agreement.

- (4) Compensation ordered by a court under this section is recoverable as if the order were a judgment by the court for a debt of the same amount owed by the owner to the boarder or lodger.

# Withdrawal from enterprise agreement before registration

- 128. (1) A party to an enterprise agreement that has been lodged for registration may, within 14 days after the meeting arranged with the Commissioner for Enterprise Agreements under section 127, give written notice to the other party or parties to the agreement that the party wishes to withdraw from the agreement.
- (2) Written notice of withdrawal must also be given within that time to the Industrial Registrar.
- (3) The application for registration of the enterprise agreement is taken to be withdrawn on receipt of the notice by the Industrial Registrar.

## Corporation to be same legal entity as Hunter Water Board

- 11. (1) On the dissolution of the Hunter Water Board, the Corporation is taken for all purposes including the rules of private international law to be a continuation of and the same legal entity as the Hunter Water Board.
- (2) This section does not affect any transfer of assets, rights and liabilities under section 6 or 9.
