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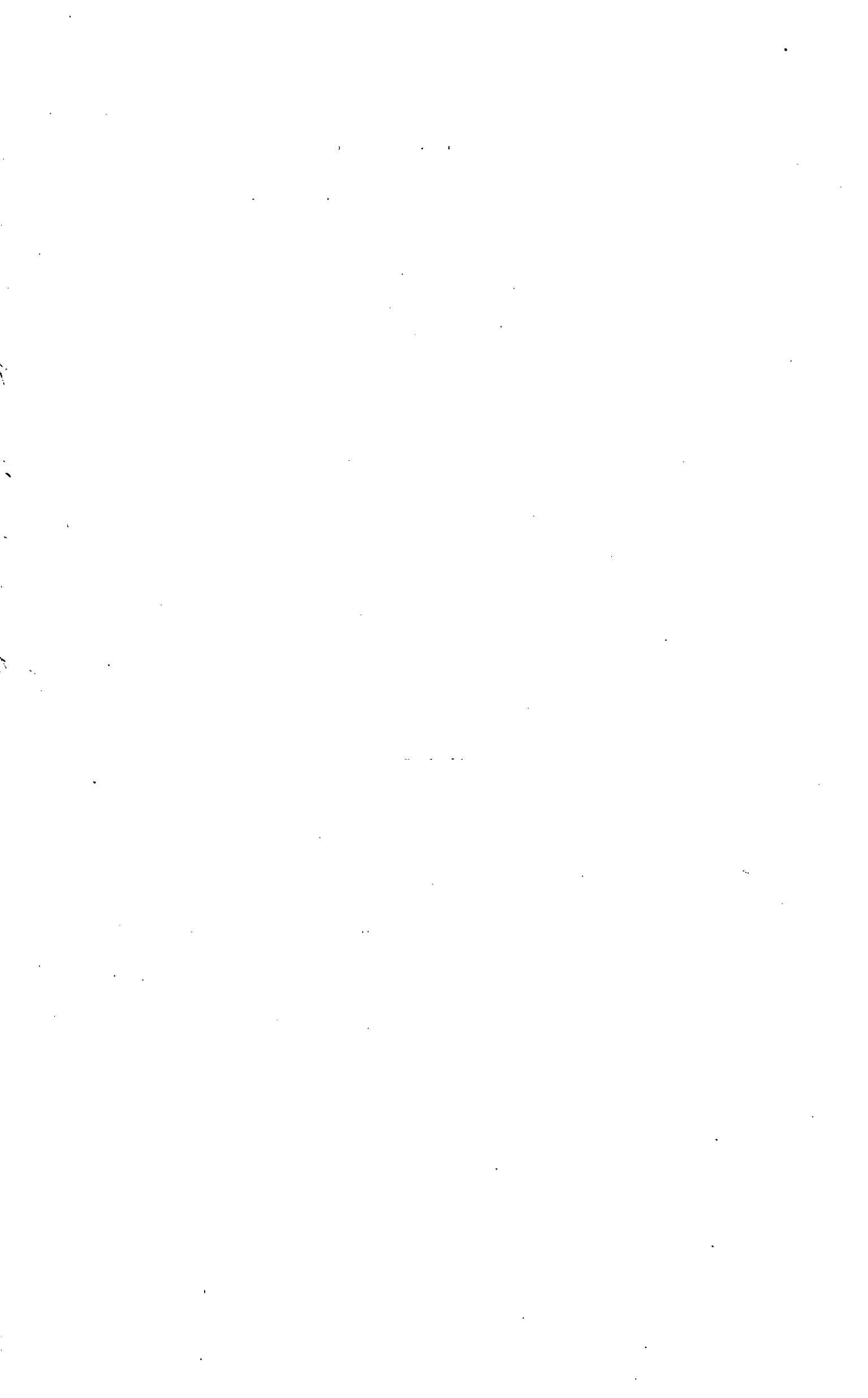

For those reasons he would not rule the Bill out of order, 116.
- That, although there might be no proposal to issue a regulation which would impose a license fee upon fruit trees used for domestic purposes, as was suggested in the motion sought to be discussed, the motion now before the House was that of "Urgency," and, therefore, he proposed to put that motion to the House, 211.
