Regulations.

Clause 22. (1) The board may, with the approval of the Governor, make regulations for carrying out the purposes of this Act, and particularly—

- (a) for the establishment, management, and control of all districts appointed as aforesaid;
  - (b) for the election of district committees and for the guidance and control of such committees;
  - (c) for elections of members of the board by district committees;
  - (d) for voting by post at any election of members of the board or of a district committee;
  - (e) for regulating the meetings of and conduct of business by the board and district committees;
  - (f) for the employment of officers and servants of the board and for payment of salaries and wages;
  - (g) for ensuring discipline and good conduct among such officers and servants;
  - (h) for the use of any property of the board and the rendering of any services by its officers and servants, and for fixing, imposing, and receiving fees and charges in respect of such use and service;
  - (i) imposing penalties for breach of any regulation made under this Act not exceeding for any offence the sum of twenty-five pounds.
- (2) Such regulation shall—
- (i) be published in the *Gazette*;
  - (ii) take effect from the date of publication, or from a later date to be specified in such regulations;
  - (iii) be laid before both Houses of Parliament within fourteen days after publication if Parliament is in session, and, if not, then within fourteen days after the commencement of the next session. If either House of Parliament passes a resolution at any time within fifteen sitting days after such regulations have been laid before such House disallowing any regulation, such regulation shall therefrom cease to have effect. [Read.]

Definitions.

Clause 2. (1) In this Act, unless the the context otherwise indicates,—

“Board” means the New South Wales Board of Trade.

“Child” means any boy or girl under “fourteen” years of age or any girl under the age of fifteen years who is not in employment whose parent is “an employee,” and includes an illegitimate “child.”

“Employee” means any person over “eighteen” years of age engaged or employed in any capacity for hire or reward in any kind of work whatsoever, whether his remuneration is by salary or wages according to time or piece-work rates or otherwise howsoever, but shall not include a member of a family in the employment of a parent, “or any person “(other than a chauffeur) engaged in or in connection with domestic duties in a private “household or otherwise than in or in connection with the business, trade, or occupation “of the employer,” and the fact that a person is working under a contract for labour only or substantially for labour only or as lessee of any tools or other implements of production or any vehicle used in the delivery of goods, shall not in itself prevent such person from being held to be an employee.

“Employer” means any person, company, corporation, firm, or “association” engaging or employing or usually engaging or employing an employee in any capacity other than in or in connection with domestic duties in a private household, and whether on behalf of himself or any other person, and whether or not the employer resides within the State. The term includes every managing director, public officer, agent, representative, or manager of any such company, corporation, firm, or association, and every manager, agent, or representative for any employer.

“Fund” means the Maintenance of Children Fund.

“Industrial Arbitration Act” means the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912, as amended by the Industrial Arbitration (Amendment) Act, 1916, the Industrial Arbitration (Amendment) Act, 1918, and the Industrial Arbitration (Further Amendment) Act, 1918.

“Minister” means the Minister for Labour and Industry, or other Minister of the Crown for the time being charged with the administration of this Act.

“Mother” includes any woman other than a paid housekeeper, nurse, or other servant in charge of the domestic affairs of a household in which a child resides, and who has the care, control, and management of a child, and if there is no such woman, the father, or any person who is otherwise in loco parentis to a child; but does not include the female parent of any child which is subject to the care, control, and management of another person to whom payments out of the fund are made in respect of such child.

“Prescribed” means prescribed by this Act or by any rule, regulation, or order made thereunder.

(2) This Act shall apply to the Crown and to any department of His Majesty's Government.

(3) This Act shall not apply to any employers or employees in so far as they are engaged in rural industries unless the conditions of employment of such employees have been regulated by any award under the Industrial Arbitration Act, or to employers whose industries are regulated by awards of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration, or employees whose wages and conditions of employment are regulated by and who are paid in accordance with an award of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration. [Read.]

- (e) except in the case of an illegitimate child an amount equal to the difference between the payments made or ordered by any court of competent jurisdiction to be made by the putative father for the support of the child and the amount which would, if the child had been born in wedlock, have been payable out of the fund in respect of the child; or

" In such case the chairman shall enter or cause to be entered upon the minutes of the proceedings of the board his reasons at length for determining such matter in opposition to the decision of the other members, and shall forward to the Minister a copy of such minute, certified under his hand.

" The other members, or either of them, may also enter upon such minutes their or his reasons in support of the decision of such members and against the disapproval of the chairman, and may forward to the Minister a copy of such minute, certified under their hands."

(e) Omit subsection nine and insert the following subsection in lieu thereof :—

(9) The members of the board shall respectively receive salaries at the following yearly rates :—The chairman, two thousand five hundred pounds; each of the other members of the board, one thousand five hundred pounds.

One of such members shall be the chairman, who may be appointed as chairman of one or more boards, and shall be paid such salary as Parliament may appropriate. The chairman shall, if present, preside at all meetings of the board, and shall have an original vote on any question before the board, and shall have a casting vote on any question on which the votes are equal.

The chairman shall have power on behalf of the board to deal with such matters as may be prescribed.

Every other member shall be paid such fee for each sitting as may be prescribed.

(2) In the event of the chairman being unable to act from any cause whatever, the Governor may appoint a deputy-chairman.

In the absence of the chairman or deputy-chairman the members present at any meeting may elect one of their number to act as chairman at such meeting or any adjournment thereof, who while so acting shall have all the powers and authorities of the chairman.

Two members shall form a quorum.

(3) Any member of a board who shall sit or act in any way as a member of such board in any case in which he is or has been directly or indirectly interested shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five hundred pounds.

The resignation or bankruptcy of any member of a board, or his absence from three consecutive meetings of the board without leave of the Minister, shall cause a vacancy in his office, and the Governor may appoint a person to supply such vacancy or any vacancy caused by the removal of a member of a board from his office. [Read].

## SAME BILL.

Clause 9: (1.) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, any land in a district could reasonably be used for a better or more productive purpose than that to which it is put he may notify in the Gazette his intention to direct that an inquiry shall be held as to whether such land or part thereof, or any estate or interest therein, should be resumed by the Governor.

Subject to the provision hereinafter contained, no disposition of such land, unless made with the consent of the Minister, shall operate to defeat the exercise of the power of resumption under this Act.

(2.) Within three months after the date of such notification the Minister may require a board to inquire and report as to—

- (a) whether such land could reasonably be used for a better or more productive purpose than that to which it is put;
- (b) whether such land or part thereof or any estate or interest therein should be resumed for the purposes of this Act; and
- (c) the value of such land or of any part thereof or of any estate or interest therein recommended for resumption, and the value of the improvements thereon based on the use to which such land has been put for the five years prior to the date of the said notification.

Such report shall not have any effect for the purposes of this section unless it is made within three months after the expiration of the three months within which the Minister may require the board to make inquiry and report as aforesaid.

(3) Where, in pursuance of this Act, part only of land owned and worked as one property is submitted to a board for inquiry and report as aforesaid, the board in making the valuation of such part shall take into consideration the area thereof in relation to the residue of the property, and whether such residue will be depreciated in value by resumption, and if so to what amount; and before any such part is resumed, the board shall report to the Minister whether the circumstances justify the owner being allowed to retain such land or any part thereof.

(4) Any decision by a board under this section shall be subject to appeal to the Land Appeal Court and to reference by the Minister in a like manner as provided in the Crown Lands Acts in the case of a decision by a local land board.

(5) If the board reports that the land could reasonably be used for a better or more productive purpose than that to which it is put, the Governor may resume such land at the value determined in the report.

(6) The right of resumption under this section shall cease if it be not exercised within three months after the decision of the board, or, in the event of an appeal, within three months after the decision of the Land Appeal Court, or if the matter be not referred to the board, as hereinbefore provided, within three months from the date of the notification in the Gazette of the intention to direct an inquiry.

(2) Where the applicant is a woman she must prove to the satisfaction of the board either that she is unmarried or a widow, or being married, that in the case of an application under paragraph (a) of the last preceding section the land on which it is proposed to erect the dwelling-house is her separate property or, in the case of an application under paragraph (b) of the said section, that the dwelling-house and land proposed to be purchased is for her separate estate.

~~26.—(1) The board shall refer all applications to the Minister, who in his absolute discretion may~~ *The granting or  
refusing of  
application.*  
**The Minister may, on the recommendation of the board, either grant the application, subject to such conditions (if any) as he thinks fit, or may refuse it.**

(2) In granting an application the Minister shall state the amount to be advanced or to be expended in erecting the dwelling-house. Such amount shall not exceed ~~seven hundred and fifty~~ **one thousand pounds, exclusive of any prescribed fees.** *Amount to be  
advanced or  
extended.*

(3) Where it is proposed to erect the dwelling-house the board shall state whether the work will be done by contract or day labour, or partly in one way and partly in another. *How work of  
board may be  
done.*

(4) The board may, subject to this Act, make regulations prescribing fees, and such fees shall in each case be added to the amount advanced or expended as aforesaid. *Fees.*

27. (1) Where an application under paragraph (a) of section twenty-four is granted, the applicant shall enter into such agreement and pay such fee as may be prescribed. (2) *Agreement to be

(2) Before any advances are made or any money is expended by the board under the said paragraph the applicant shall pay to the board five per centum of the amount proposed to be advanced or expended. Provided that in lieu of such payment the board may accept from the applicant security therefore.

## RETURNED SOLDIERS AND SAILORS VOTING BILL.

Right to vote.

Clause 3. (1) At any election or poll of electors held during the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty in any municipality or shire a sailor or soldier may, if qualified as by this Act provided, vote without enrolment or any qualification such as is provided in any other Act.

(3) For the purposes of any Act relating to local government a sailor or soldier qualified to vote under this Act shall be entitled to the rights and privileges of a person whose name is on a roll of electors. [*Read.*]

Clause 5. In this Act, except where the context or subject-matter otherwise indicates or requires,—

“ Commission ” means the Commissioners appointed under this Act.

“ Commissioner ” means a member of the Commission.

“ Fixed price ” means the maximum price of any necessary commodity as fixed and declared by the Commission.

“ Fixed rate ” means the maximum rate of carriage as fixed and declared by the Commission.

“ Inspector ” means an inspector appointed under this Act.

“ Minister ” means the Minister of the Crown to whom the administration of this Act is for the time being committed by the Governor.

“ Necessary commodity ” or “ commodity ” means any of the following :—

(h) Tools of Trade.

(i) Seeds for sowing.

(j) Any article of furniture.

(k) Any building material.

(m) Drugs, proprietary medicines, medical instruments, chemicals, disinfectants, soaps, and toilet requisites.

(n) Oils.

(o) Any commodity which the Governor upon the recommendation of the Commission declares in the Gazette to be a necessary commodity.

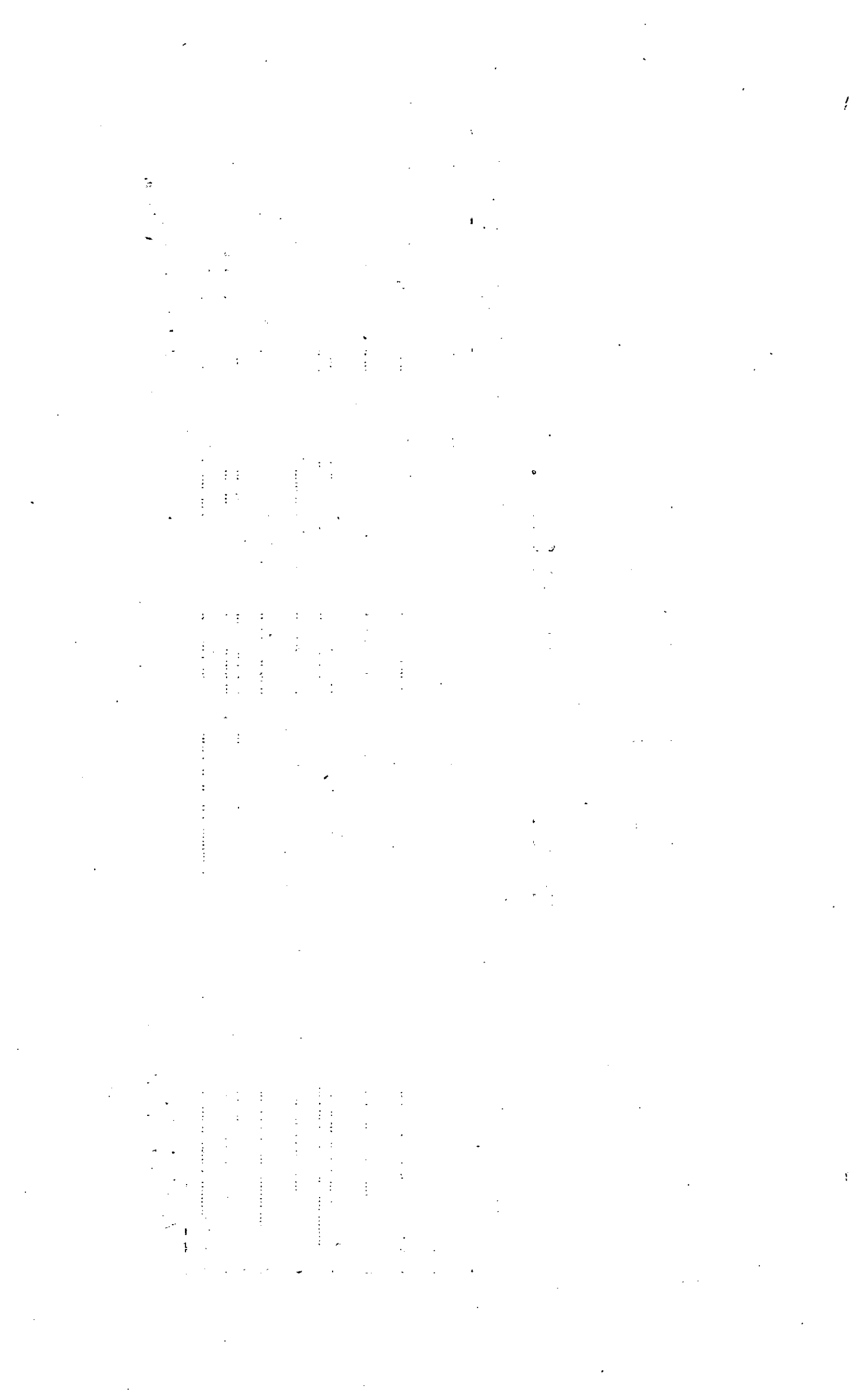

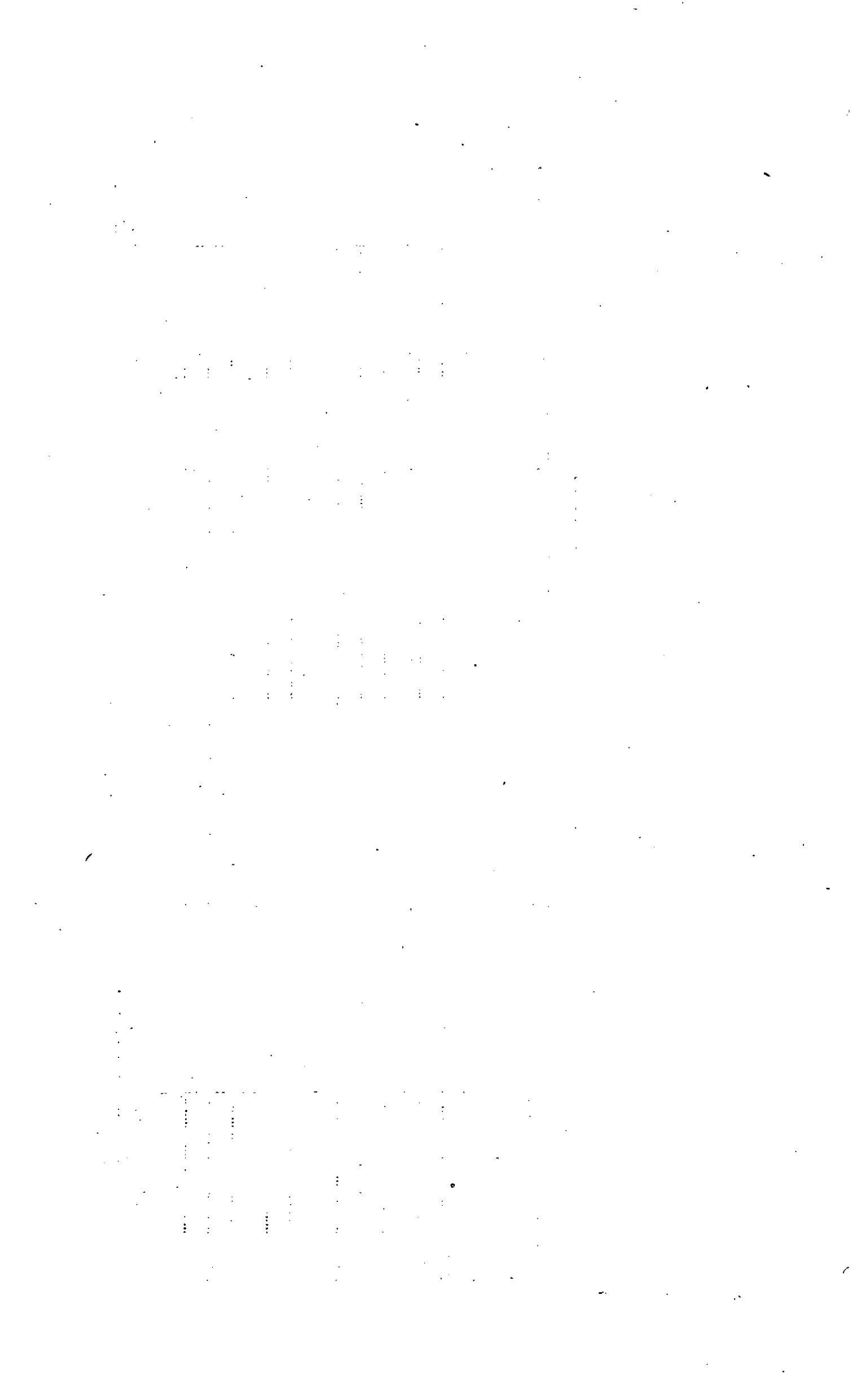
