LOCAL GOVERNMENT AMENDMENT (PREFERENCE TO AUSTRALIAN AND EMPIRE GOODS)

BILL:—

Clause 1 having been dealt with,—

Clause 2. The Local Government Act, 1919, is amended by inserting next after section five hundred and seventeen the following new section:—

517A. (1) In purchasing or obtaining any goods the Council "shall" give effective and substantial preference to goods manufactured or produced in the Commonwealth.

(2) If goods manufactured or produced in the Commonwealth cannot be purchased, or can only be purchased in insufficient quantities, or of a quality unsuitable for the purpose required, the council shall give effective and substantial preference to British goods over foreign goods.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT AMENDMENT (PREFERENCE TO AUSTRALIAN AND EMPIRE GOODS)

BILL—(Further considered):—

Clause 1 having been dealt with,—

Clause 2. The Local Government Act, 1919, is amended by inserting next after section five hundred and seventeen the following new section:—

517A. (1) In purchasing or obtaining any goods the council shall give effective and substantial preference to goods manufactured or produced in the Commonwealth.

(2) If goods manufactured or produced in the Commonwealth cannot be purchased, or can only be purchased in insufficient quantities, or of a quality unsuitable for the purpose required, the council shall give effective and substantial preference to British goods over foreign goods.

(3) The minimum rates of preference to be given under this section are indicated in the table following:—

Rate of Custom duty to which the goods are liable:	Minimum rate of preference to be given to goods manufactured or produced in the Commonwealth over—	
	British goods.	Foreign goods.
"Duty free	20 per centum ...	30 per centum.
"5 per centum	15 " " ...	25 " "
"10 " " or more	10 " " ...	20 " "

Amendment of Act No. 41, 1919. New s. 547 A.

Preference to Australian and British goods. cf. L.G. Act, 1915 (Vic.), s. 457.

"In all cases goods manufactured or produced in the Commonwealth are to be given preference of at least ten per centum over British goods."

In all cases British goods are to be given preference of at least ten per centum over foreign goods.

(4) In this section—

"British goods" means goods manufactured or produced at any place within the British Empire;

"Commonwealth" means the Commonwealth of Australia;

"Foreign goods" means goods manufactured or produced at any place outside the British Empire;

"Goods" includes machinery or material.

(5) The provisions of section two hundred and thirteen with respect to surcharges shall apply in relation to any expenditure authorised by a council in contravention of the provisions of this section. [Read.]

Clause 1 having been dealt with,—

Clause 2. (1) The Principal Act is amended—

- (a) (i) by omitting from subsection one of section seven the word “four” and inserting in lieu thereof the word “six” “seven”;
(ii) by omitting from subsection two of the same section the word “three” and inserting in lieu thereof the word “four”;

- (b) (i) by inserting at the end of subsection one of section eight after the word "Governor" the words "and shall hold office for five years from the date of appointment"; Sec. 8 (1). (President.)
- (ii) by omitting from subsection two of the same section the word "four" and inserting in lieu thereof the word "six" **seven**; Sec. 8 (2). (Election of members.)
- (c) (i) by omitting from subsection four of section nine the words "one member" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "two **three** members"; Sec. 9 (4). (Representatives of insurance companies.)
- (ii) by omitting section five of the same section and by inserting next after subsection four the following new subsection:—
- (5) One member of the board shall be elected by the members of the volunteer fire "brigades." At such election each member of such brigade shall have one vote. By members of Volunteer Fire Brigades.
- (5A) One member of the board shall be elected by the members of the ~~Fire Brigades Employees' Union.~~ **At such election each member of such union permanent firemen who are members of the Fire Brigades Association of New South Wales; at such election each such member of such Association shall have one vote.** By members of Fire Brigades Employees' Union.
- (d) (i) by omitting from section twelve the words "six hundred pounds" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "nine hundred pounds"; Sec. 12. (Fees to members.)
- (ii) by omitting from the same section the words "an annual salary of three hundred pounds" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "such annual salary as shall be fixed by the Governor." Ibid. (Salary of President.)
- (e) By omitting from subsection three of section seventeen the following words:—"The amount so borrowed whether by debentures or otherwise shall be so that the amount owing by the board shall not at any time exceed one hundred and fifty thousand pounds." Sec. 17 (3). (Amount to be borrowed.)
- (2) **The members of the board in office at the commencement of this Act shall continue to hold office for the period for which they were elected, and shall be eligible for re-election.**
- The first members elected in accordance with subsections five and 5A of section nine inserted in the Principal Act by this Act, shall hold office only for the balance of the period for which the members of the board at such commencement were elected, and shall be eligible for re-election.

WHEAT BILL:—

Clauses 9 to 14 having been dealt with,—

Clause 15. (1) After the delivery of any wheat in respect of which a warrant has been produced as provided in section twelve of this Act, the Government and the manager of the Government grain elevators shall not be answerable to any other person claiming to be the owner of such wheat or of any interest therein.

“(2) The Government of New South Wales shall not be responsible for—

“(a) any loss of or damage to wheat in its charge arising from irresistible force, the act of God or the King's enemies, strikes, lock-outs, or any other cause beyond its control; or

“(b) any loss which may be sustained by reason of the short supply or non-supply of railway trucks to any elevator for the purpose of moving wheat therefrom under the instructions of the owner of the wheat.

“(3) Where wheat in an elevator is destroyed or damaged by any of the causes referred to in paragraph (a) of subsection two of this section all persons at the time of the loss entitled to delivery of wheat under warrants shall bear the loss in a proportion to be fixed by the manager of the Government grain elevators approximating as nearly as can be calculated by him to the proportion that the wheat which such persons are entitled by the warrant to receive bears to the total stocks of wheat then in store in the Government elevators, and the amount of wheat deliverable on the warrants then in force shall be reduced accordingly.”

(4) Where from any cause for which the Government is responsible damage to or loss of wheat occurs, the liability of the Government shall be limited to the market value of the wheat at the time of the loss or damage.

(5) Where the Government is unable from any cause for which it is responsible to deliver wheat in the quantity and of the quality mentioned in a warrant, the Government may pay to the owner of the warrant the amount of the market value of the wheat mentioned in the warrant as at the date on which delivery is sought, or at its option the value as at the date according to the certificate of the said manager at which stocks of like wheat in the Government elevators became exhausted, but at a date not later than the fifteenth of November of the current year, and the Government shall not be responsible to any further extent for any damages, loss, costs, charges, or expenses resulting from its failure to so deliver the wheat.

6. (1) Every person—

(a) going into or being in occupation of any factory shall within fourteen days of such going into or being in occupation ; or

* * * * *

(3) If the chief inspector decides to register or to issue a permit to occupy the premises as a factory, he shall, on payment of the prescribed registration fee by the occupier or applicant issue to the occupier or applicant a certificate of registration or a permit, as the case may be, in the form prescribed, specifying the name of the occupier and the address and situation of the factory, and the nature of the work to be carried on therein.

* * * * *

(2) if in any year a change of occupancy occurs in a factory for which a registration fee has been paid for that year, the fee to be paid for such further registration shall be twenty per centum of the amount specified in the said Schedule, irrespective of the date upon which such change occurs, provided that the fee so payable shall be not less than two shillings and sixpence.

(3) “In any case where during the currency of the registration the number of persons employed in the factory is so increased as to require a larger registration fee the occupier of the factory shall, within twenty-one days thereafter, give written notice thereof to the inspector, and pay the difference in value between the registration fee already paid and the fee payable on such increased number.”

(a) by inserting in lieu thereof the following new section:—

* * * * *

(5) No building or portion of a building or curtilage of such building shall be used as a furniture factory "if such building or the curtilage thereof has internal communication with any adjoining premises or provides for ingress or egress otherwise than from a street or public lane, or" if Chinese working in such building prepare or partake of meals, board, lodge, sleep therein, or are thereupon or therein at any time at which Chinese may not lawfully work therein.

* * * * *

(8) If any person offends against any of the provisions of this section, he shall, for each and every day on which he offends, be liable for the first offence to a penalty of not less than three pounds nor more than ten pounds, and for a second or subsequent offence a penalty not less than fifteen pounds nor more than fifty pounds, and in addition to the foregoing penalty, the registration of a factory, the occupier of which is convicted under this section for a third offence, "shall" be forthwith cancelled by the Minister.

(9) In order to meet the exigencies of trade the Minister may, subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed in section forty-three, suspend the operation of this section relating to the working hours in any factory for any period not exceeding two four weeks. *[Read.]*

All furniture manufactured or prepared either wholly or partly in New South Wales shall, as soon as it has been practically completed so as to permit the stamp being placed on it, and before it is sent out or removed from the building, premises, or place in which it is so manufactured or prepared, and all furniture imported into New South Wales shall be legibly and permanently stamped with a stamp of an indelible permanent ink, or stain, or impression.

~~3. Such stamp shall set forth in legible type the manufacturer's true name and the address of the place in which such furniture was manufactured or prepared. If such furniture was only partly manufactured or prepared by such manufacturer the words "partly prepared by" shall be stamped above such manufacturer's name and address.~~

3. Such stamp shall set forth in legible type the distinguishing number or letter or combination of same (herein called the maker's mark) assigned by the Chief Inspector to each manufacturer of furniture corresponding with the true name and address of such manufacturer, as appearing in a register made, and kept by the Chief Inspector for the purpose. If such furniture was only partly manufactured or prepared by such manufacturer, the words "partly prepared by" shall be stamped above the maker's mark of such manufacture.

* * * * *

17. The Secretary of the registered industrial union of employers or employees in the furniture industry or an officer authorised by him in writing shall have the like powers as are conferred upon an inspector by paragraphs one, two, and six "of" section nine of this Act.
