COMMITTEE OF SUPPLY (*Supply Bill*):—*Resolution*,—That there be granted to Her Majesty:—

- (a) A sum not exceeding £15,941,100, payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the State during the months of October and November, or following month of the financial year ending 30th June, 1956, to be expended at the rates which are shown on the Estimates for the financial year ending 30th June, 1956, as laid upon the Table of the House, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year 1955-1956.
- (b) A sum not exceeding £11,961,900, payable out of the Government Railways Fund, to defray the salaries, maintenance, and working expenses and other expenses of the Department of Railways during the months of October and November, or following month of the financial year ending 30th June, 1956, to be expended at the rates which are shown on the Estimates for the financial year ending 30th June, 1956, as laid upon the Table of the House, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year 1955-1956.

(ii) where the owner has not so agreed—the fair market value of the land as assessed by an advisory board, or where an appeal has been made in terms of section nine of this Act, the fair market value of the land as determined by the Land and Valuation Court.

* * * * *

(d) by omitting paragraph (b) of subsection one of section eight;

* * * * * (Restrictions on right of resumption.)

(g) by omitting from subsection one of section thirteen the words "fourteen thousand pounds" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "twenty thousand pounds, or in any case where the Minister on the recommendation of an advisory board fixes a greater amount than twenty thousand pounds, such greater amount."

* * * * *

(4) The amendments made by subsections one, two and three of this section shall not extend to nor affect the price or compensation payable for any land purchased or resumed before the commencement of this Act or any action, suit, proceeding, matter or thing pending or uncompleted at such commencement. The price or compensation payable for any land purchased or resumed before the commencement of this Act shall be the price or compensation which would have been payable had such amendments not been made, and any action, suit, proceeding, matter or thing pending or uncompleted at such commencement in respect of any resumption effected before such commencement may be continued and completed as if such amendments had not been made.

Amendment (*Mr. Crawford*) to omit subparagraph (1) (c) (i) (e) and insert the following subparagraph instead thereof:—

“Where any Act has been passed since the commencement of the Closer Settlement (Amendment), Act, 1937, authorising the construction of a line of railway, or where at any time an Act has been passed authorising the construction of any PUBLIC WORK and the Governor is of the opinion that an added value will accrue or has accrued to any land by reason of the construction of the said line of railway, or the construction or proposed construction or the utilization of the public work; or in any case where a Provisional District or a Domestic and Stock Water Supply and Irrigation District has been or is constituted under Part VI of the Water Act 1912-1936, such added value shall be vested in the Crown. The term ‘added value’ includes and shall be deemed always to have included any additional value which would accrue or has accrued to such land from the attachment to such land of water rights or any other rights under the provisions of the Water Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, or from the actual or prospective enjoyment of water rights or other such rights.

In relation to the added value as applied to the construction of a line of railway, the term ‘added value’ is confined to land situated wholly or partly within fifteen miles on either side of the line of the railway or within a radius of fifteen miles from the terminus thereof.

In any assessment of compensation or in any determination of the value of the land for the purpose of compensation upon any purchase or resumption there shall be excluded any added value referred to.”

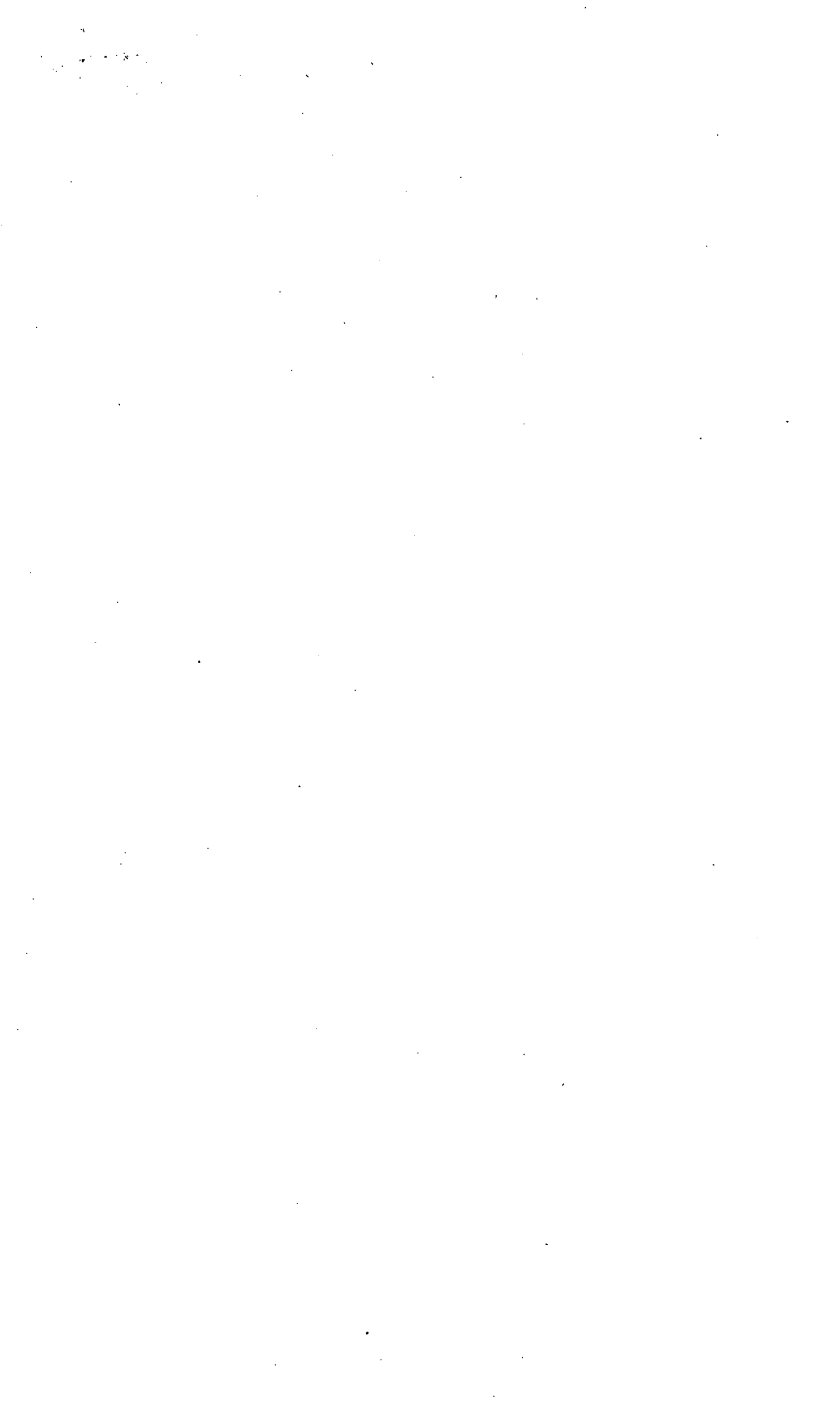

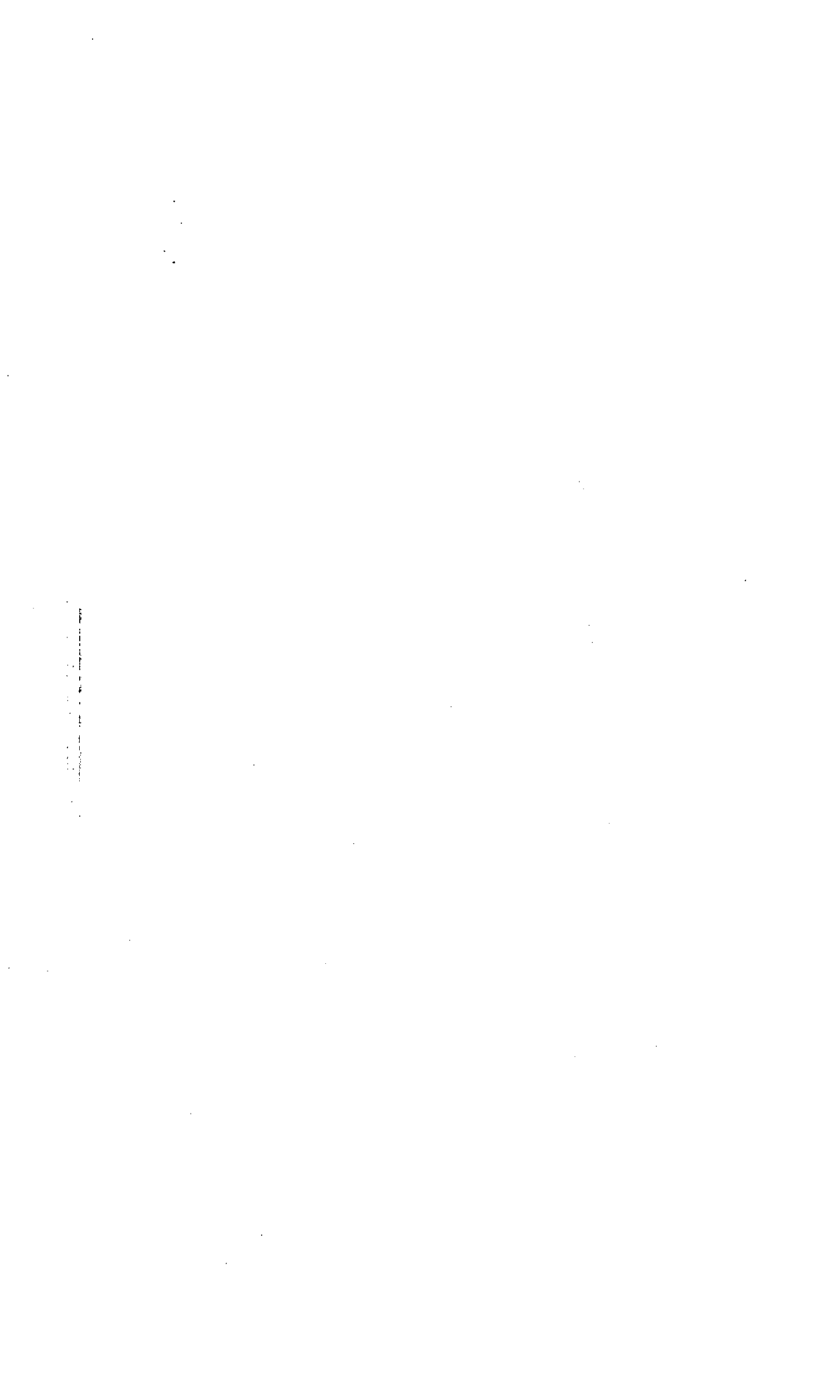
