## MOTION OF URGENCY—NOMINATION OF MEMBER AS CHAIRMAN OF COMMITTEES MUST BE BY SUBSTANTIVE MOTION :—

- That the Urgency Motion under Standing Order 395 having been carried by the House for the purpose of passing a specific motion—"That Robert Bruce Walker be Chairman of Committees of the whole House for the present Session"—he would rule the amendment to amend the consequent motion to suspend the Standing Orders, out of order, 8-9.

The Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Bill was a matter of State policy—within the meaning of the rule laid down by Mr. Speaker Abbot in the House of Commons on the 17th July, 1811—and the disqualification from voting did not apply to the measure before the House, 20.
