[*Opened 6th September, 1932. Prorogued 9th January, 1933.*]

IN ONE VOLUME

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 That he could not uphold the contention of the Leader of the Opposition (*Mr. Lang*), that the Finance (Bookmakers' Taxation) Bill did not correspond with the Resolution from Ways and Means upon which the Bill was founded, 45.  
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 That a motion of urgency for the suspension of Standing and Sessional Orders to consider a motion relating to the action of the police in using batons upon certain citizens of Lithgow was out of order, as the subject matter of the motion was *sub judice*, 141.

## IN HARTLEY ELECTORATE :—

- Motion made (*Mr. Knight*) (*after suspension of Standing and Sessional Orders as matter of Urgency*), "That, in the opinion of this House, steps should be immediately taken to settle the dispute between the Government and storekeepers, concerning supply of, 125-6.

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- Motion made for Address in Reply, 10; (*during Debate Mr. Speaker upheld sub-judice rule respecting certain references to evidence given before the Royal Commission of Inquiry upon Greyhound Racing*, 11); amendment moved (*Mr. Lang*) to add words to stand as paragraph (4), 12; amendment *negatived*, and Address agreed to, 13; presented to, and reply reported, 35.

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- Motion made (*Mr. Lang*) after suspension of Standing Orders (*Urgency*), that Government is deserving of censure upon certain grounds associated with the findings of the Commission, and specified in the motion, *negatived*, 133-4.
