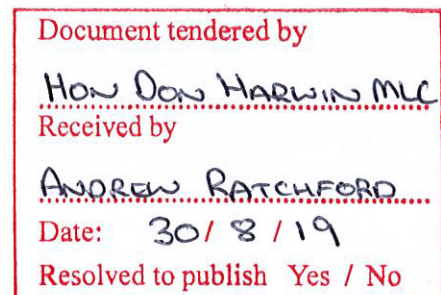

Guy Maestri (b. 1974) <i>Nude</i>, 2011 black pastel on paper 32 x 24 cm signed with initials and dated 'GM 11' (lower right)</p> <p>Provenance Gift from the artist</p> <p>This value is based upon an exhibition of paintings and works on paper held at Olsen Gallery, Sydney in 2011, where the ink on paper landscape works measuring the same size sold for \$1,350. The subject of this work would have slightly less value to it. He has not exhibited his works on paper since 2011, and his current dealer Jan Murphy Gallery in Brisbane confirmed this would be the present value.</p>	<p>\$1,200.</p>	
<p>2. Ben Quilty (b. 1973) <i>Portrait of Margaret Olley</i>, 2011 etching on paper 24.6 x 19.5 cm (image) 40 x 32 cm (paper) signed with initials and dated 'bq11' (lower right) and numbered 'AP' (lower left)</p> <p>Provenance Gift from the artist</p> <p>This value is based upon the importance of this image in Quilty's oeuvre. In speaking with his dealer Jan Murphy Gallery in Brisbane, she confirmed that this work is part of a triptych, and that she sold that triptych unframed in 2011 for \$10,000. Quilty's other dealer Tolarno Galleries, Melbourne confirmed that they had two of the Olley images from the triptych on exhibition in 2014 with sale price of \$5,000 on each, however, neither sold. I have come to a median value between these two prices to reach the present value.</p>	<p>\$4,000.</p>	
<p>I have inspected the above detailed works of art and have found all to be in all respects authentic and in true and original in condition.</p> <p>This valuation is for market purposes and for no other purpose whatsoever for the foregoing artworks at the prices affixed, making the total market value of all the artworks in the collection to be five thousand, two hundred Australian dollars.</p>	<p>\$5,200.</p>


