

Question:	Ms Crawford, how common is it for a government agency to be gifting property of something like a \$9,000 item?
Answer:	We don't believe that a \$9,000 gift of government property is common. We plan to look at any gifting of assets across the State's major agencies and report any findings in our Internal Controls and Governance 2022 volume which should be tabled in Parliament during December 2022.
Question:	I've been trying to imagine a circumstance where this might apply. I guess one of the situations might be, for example, TAHE—who we know and love—are moving premises, and you might imagine that in the course of moving premises they have a bunch of furniture or computers or whatever and that they might not want to have to account for every single one of them. What has normally happened in those sorts of circumstances where you've had office moves and things? Do you normally see disclosure of those items on the register?
Answer:	We plan to look at any gifting of assets across the State's major agencies and report any findings in our Internal Controls and Governance 2022 volume which should be tabled in Parliament during December 2022.
Question:	I did see your work program for the year that's coming. What other performance audits are we expecting this year from last year's program?
