Notes and costing assumptions

The policy proposes to double current funding for the NSW Police Workforce Improvement Program over 3 years from 2019-20. The total cost of the policy is \$12.3 million over the forward estimates.

Key assumptions:

In 2019-20, the current budget of NSW Police Force for the Workforce Improvement Program is \$3.998 million. The costing assumes that annual funding would be doubled relative to the current allocations, i.e an additional \$3.998 million to be allocated for this program.

The total expenditure for NSW Police Workforce Improvement Program has been indexed according to the Sydney Consumer Price Index (CPI) forecasts/projections in the Pre-Election Budget Update: 2.25% in 2020-21 and 2.5% in 2021-22.

The costing assumes that additional administrative costs would be met within existing agency resources.
