Notes and costing assumptions

The policy proposes to establish a koala national park in south west Sydney on publicly owned land around the Upper Georges River from 1 July 2019. The park is based on a proposal from the Georges River Koala Network. The proposed park would be established between Glenfield and Appin (indicative map overleaf). The total cost of the policy over the forward estimates is \$13.3 million.

Key assumptions

- The Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) has advised that establishment costs of the park over the first three years would be \$1,110/ha or \$4.4 million per year, with \$615/ha ongoing (4-20 years) or \$2.6 million per year. These amounts are unescalated.
- Total management costs would be \$55.1 million over 20 years (unescalated).
