## Notes and costing assumptions

This policy proposes to allocate \$25 million over the forward estimates, from 1 July 2019, as grants to local councils for main street rejuvenation projects. The program would finish on 20 June 2022.

The funding would be a capped, nominal, allocation to the Office of Local Government for distribution to local councils. Eligible projects would be assessed, and funding approved, based on program guidelines developed upon formation of government from April 2019.

The policy indicates that eligible projects would need to be jointly funded by the local council.

The PBO assumes that any unspent funds would be returned to the Consolidated Fund as per usual Budget practice.
