Notes and costing assumptions

The policy proposes to deliver 68 train station upgrades from 1 July 2019. All upgrades will be funded within three program budgets detailed below. There is no budget impact on the forward estimates as projects are already funded. **Table 1** provides a breakdown of the funding.

The proposed upgrades are funded through three sources: the Transport Access Program (TAP), the Sydney Metro Project (SMP), and Transport capital funding. TAP funds the upgrade of 61 stations and SMP funds upgrades for five stations. Transport for NSW (TfNSW)has advised that funding for the two remaining stations (Moss Vale and Tuggerah) will come from its capital budget.

There is currently no provision for these stations in the forward estimates and the PBO assumes that funding would be met by way of a reprioritisation of projects. A reprioritisation of this scale will likely require cancellation or delay of other exisiting projects. **Table 2** lists the stations and programs under which they will be funded.

Notes and costing assumptions continued:

The upgrades are proposed to make train stations compliant with the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* (Cth) and would include lifts, platform and concourse refurbishments, and safety and modernisation upgrades. These upgrades are separate to the installation of commuter car parks at stations.

Transport Access Program

As advised by TfNSW, costs are based on the scope and methodology outlined in the TAP project management plan. The PBO understands that upgrades for 21 train stations have already been announced. The policy nominates an additional 40 locations for train station upgrades.

Sydney Metro Project

The policy proposes easy access upgrades for five stations between Sydenham and Bankstown (see **Table 2**). These upgrades form part of the Sydney Metro City & Southwest Project. The cost of these upgrades are based on TfNSW estimates of work.

Transport capital funding

The Moss Vale and Tuggerah station upgrades would be funded outside of the TAP, with the net cost of these upgrades estimated to be \$63.8 million in total. The policy specifies that the funding will come from TfNSW's existing capital budget, however Transport have advised that there is currently no provision for these stations. To fund these stations, the PBO assumes that a reprioritisation of projects would be required.

General assumptions:

On advice from TfNSW the costing assumes:

- Estimated costs are based on the latest available market price (4th quarter of 2018).
- Costs include electricity connection and communication requirements.
- An escalation rate of 3.9% has been applied based on TfNSW advice.
- The costing excludes delivery management costs including client procured design.
