Additional \$45 million funding over four years for Events NSW is allocated evenly across years 2011-12 to 2014-15, amounting to \$11.25 million per year. The \$2.25 million for the Sydney Film Festival and \$1 million for prominent exhibitions are part of the \$45 million total.

\$10.5 million funding over four years for "It's On in Sydney" campaign is allocated evenly across years 2011-12 to 2014-15, amounting to \$2.625 million per year.

NSW Treasury have confirmed that the \$57 million cost of new cruise passenger terminal is already included in the 2010-11 budget.

\$5 million allocated in 2011-12 to finalise concept plan for convention and exhibition space in Sydney.
