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Costing assumptions used:

It is assumed that 50 welfare workers will commence employment in July 2011 and that the number of workers will be limited to 50 regardless of the number of schools in the South Western Sydney region.

The Department of Education and Training has advised that the average salary per youth worker is \$86,868 per annum including on-costs.

The costs of evaluating the program will be \$200,000 p.a.

The costs of an implementation/communication strategy will be \$245,000 in 2011-12 and \$80,700 in each year thereafter.

Costs are escalated at 2.5% p.a.
