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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) has divided NSW into 28 Statistical Areas Level 4 according to the Australian Statistical Geography Standard which came into effect from July 2011 onwards. Fifteen of these areas fall within Sydney and the Central Coast, namely:

- Baulkham Hills and Hawkesbury
- Blacktown
- Central Coast
- City and Inner South
- Eastern Suburbs
- Inner South West
- Inner West
- North Sydney and Hornsby
- Northern Beaches
- Outer South West
- Outer West and Blue Mountains
- Parramatta
- Ryde
- South West
- Sutherland

The map on the following page shows the location of each of the above areas within Sydney.

Based on Census data as compiled by the ABS, a profile is provided in this paper for each of the above areas (the remaining 13 Statistical Areas in NSW that fall outside Sydney and the Central Coast were the subject of a previous paper).¹ In each case, the first section is comprised of a profile based on the results from the 2011 Census and so reveals the current situation, whilst the second time series section compares results from the 2001, 2006 and 2011 Census data and is useful for gaining an understanding of some of the changes experienced in an area over the last decade. Some of these trends are particular to the specific area. However, there are some common changes that have occurred over the last decade in the majority of the areas including:

• Fewer people have changed address in the last five years. For example, in the 2001 Census, 40% of people had moved within the last five years in the Baulkham Hills and Hawkesbury area. However, by 2011, the proportion had fallen to 30.2%.

- There has been an increase in the proportion of people born overseas as well as those who speak a language other than English at home.
- There has been a fall in the percentage of people identifying as being of Christian religion. For example, 74.1% of people in the Blacktown area identified as being of Christian religion in the 2001 Census. By 2011, this had decreased to 66.3%. Whilst there has been a simultaneous increase in the percentage of people identifying with other religions, the most noticeable increase by far has generally been in the field of those identifying as being of no religion. For example, in the City and Inner South, the percentage increased from 17.4% in 2001 to 28.3% in 2011.
- The proportion of people with tertiary qualifications has grown. This growth was particularly dramatic in Parramatta, from 28.2% of persons aged 15 years and over in 2001 to 48.8% by 2011.
- The proportion of dwellings that are fully owned has decreased. At the same time, the percentage of dwellings that are owned with a mortgage has risen. For example, in the Inner South West, the proportion of dwellings fully owned fell from 45.6% in 2001 to 32.6% in 2011, whilst in the same period the proportion of dwellings owned with a mortgage increased from 17.5% to 30.1%.

The NSW average is noted for each indicator and a Sydney and Central Coast average is included in the summary of key findings (pp 1-5). There are some noticeable differences between those Statistical Areas that fall within Sydney and the Central Coast and NSW generally. Some of these are highlighted below:

- Ethnicity: A greater proportion of people in the Sydney and Central Coast region were born overseas and/or in non-English speaking countries. More people had parents who were born overseas and more people spoke a language other than English at home than in NSW generally.
- Education: A greater proportion of people in Sydney completed Year 12 compared to the NSW average and there were more persons with tertiary education.
- **Dwellings**: Fewer dwellings are separate houses in the Sydney region whilst flats or apartments are more common than in NSW as a whole.

The figures for the two sections for each Statistical Area may differ slightly. Those in the first section are taken from the 2011 Census data based on place of usual residence. The figures for the second time series section are based on place of enumeration. The proportions are also different in some instances to ensure consistency between the three Censuses used. For example, the first section calculates the percentage of different family types by reference to total families, whereas the second section calculates family types by reference to the total number of households. The reference point used in each section is made clear.
